Traffic Issues

The proposed plans for traffic calming measures on Blanchards Lane have been delayed due to concerns about their potential to exacerbate flooding on Westgate. EYRC have carried out a topographical survey to assess these issues but, despite requests from the Parish Council, we have not received any update. We will continue to talk to EYRC and will update you as soon as we can.

Queen's Jubilee

Plans for the celebrations for the Queen's Jubilee are now well underway. Although these are being run independently of NCPC, we have been quite heavily involved. A mini-Olympics is being planned and we would encourage everybody to take part. Other celebratory events have been planned including a band.

NCPC has provided funding for Queen's Jubilee mugs which will be given to the children at North Cave Primary School. There will be some spare which will be available for purchase on a first-come first-served basis.

A special Songs of Praise at All Saints Church will be held at 11 a.m. on the 5th June to celebrate the event and will be followed by a quarter peal of bells from 12.30 until 3.30. A full peal of bells will also be rung for 3 hrs on the 4th June starting at 10 a.m.

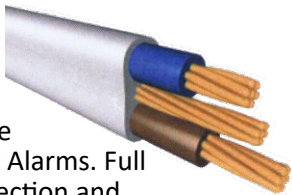

Update for Spring 2022

As mentioned last time, our actions are split into **Strategic themes** and **Site-specific projects**.

Strategic themes

1 - Watercourse management We have agreed to produce guidance which looks at the tensions between watercourse clearance and management for flooding, and the maintenance of habitat for wildlife. We can't treat our lovely chalk streams as nothing more than drains.

We are talking to University of Hull Biology Department about surveying water quality and wildlife health across the catchment. With our other partners (East Yorkshire Rivers Trust and Yorkshire Wildlife Trust) this is a great opportunity to find out what we have got and how we can look after it better. EYRT and others may be able to run community (and possibly school) workshops, to reveal the wildlife we have in our becks and to understand why our chalk streams are so special.

2 - Natural Flood Management (NFM)

We were wondering about creating a computer model to establish what NFM measures might make a difference to flooding, but our partners have explained that a model of a chalk catchment is especially difficult, expensive and unreliable (a bit like modelling a sponge, rather than a rock). Their advice: just do the NFM, wherever you can, the higher in the catchment the better.

We are also gathering a new group to look at leaky dam design, including NFM experts from other parts of the country. And whilst it may not be practical to model the whole catchment, we are looking at modelling particular locations in Newbald, North Cave and Ellerker to see what sort of volumes could be stored and how much difference they might make to flows.

3 - Agriculture There is so much changing in farm payments, following Brexit, and there are new opportunities coming up in terms of soil management, carbon capture, tree planting etc. So we are starting to plan a free event, designed for farmers and landowners and using our expert partners, to help explain and discuss these new options. Please watch out for notices.

4 - Data capture University of Hull is offering both expertise and funding to help make our river and weather data capture system a reality. We will be prototyping a river-level monitor this year at a particular site, with the aim of rolling them out to other properties over the next year or so. We are hoping to install weather stations at all four of our catchment schools: Newbald, North Cave, South Cave and Elloughton. Yorkshire Water has said they may be able to help with this.

5 - Waste and Surface water We are waiting for Yorkshire Water to get stuck into this one!

6 - Schools As you will have seen from the North Cave School page, we have had some great sessions with the children. They asked important questions and reported seeing wildlife in the beck that we didn't know about - they are a lot more in touch with nature than we are! We are hoping that we may be able to work with them on direct projects to 'Slow The Flow' in the school grounds in the not-too-distant future.

Site Specific

We are hoping to organise an expert group to look at each of the site areas that we listed in the last issue (Newbald, Nordham, Drewton Beck, Litlemoor Drain, Ferry Beck/West End, Ellerker). As we have always said, experts are not just the flood risk agencies, but critically local landowners, farmers and residents. We look forward to the challenge and opportunity to bring the *real* experts together!

Website

We have recently updated our online maps to include Google Maps. We like the way we can show project areas on our ARC 'project mapping' but we also like the way that Google Maps allows us to drop into Streetview - so now we have both.

We are about to launch a **discussion forum**, covering all of the topics above and releasing news and updates as they happen. You will be able to register for any/all updates and, as it is a discussion forum, put your own point of view - hopefully politely and constructively! We look forward to chatting to you there - announcements to follow soon.

East Riding Ringing Centre, All Saints, North Cave Annual Report 2021



We decided to make full use of the forced periods of no activity during 2021 by carrying out some planned maintenance, this included taking down three of the ropes so that they could be sent away to have new tail-end fitted to them and the

installation of a spider. We had been having trouble with a couple of the sensors on our simulator so all six were removed and sent away to David Bagley to be fully refurbished and upgraded, I must take this opportunity in thanking David for his advice and generosity.

On 1st August we held a tower open day as part of the YACR Yorkshire Day Ringing event, which was a huge success with around forty visitors coming along to see views of the village and the surrounding countryside along with a tour of the bells and, in most cases, having a go at a few hand & backstrokes. The work we put for the open day paid dividends as it generated two recruits, Christine Godfrey and Andy Rignall who now form part of our Sunday Service band.

We also had great success with 'lapsed' or, as I like to call them, 'ready-made ringers' with Paul Johnson coming back to ringing after some twenty odd years and the return of Pete Shingles. I would also like to welcome experienced ringers Vicky Herring and Steve McCullough to North Cave team.

Our practice nights have turned into a bit of a marathon starting at 6.00pm on the simulator training our own ringers along with the new band we have set up at Bubworth, we then we go open bell from 7.30pm. We have been averaging fourteen ringers attending practice nights and, on some occasions, this has even peaked at eighteen, so the evenings are always very busy and varied.

Following the lifting of restrictions, we gently

eased back into Sunday Service ringing, I would like to thank our President, Ann Neville, and James Goodwin for their help with some of our service ringing, having had time off the ropes I think it benefited all. To keep the service bands to a group of six we started to run a rota between our ringers which worked for us very successfully.

During the summer Bill rang a few Hymns on the Ellacombe chimes then, following some very nice comments about it in the White Hart, Bill has now started to do a monthly recital on a Saturday morning. On one such occasion when I was listening outside a round of applause was heard coming from the car park opposite at the end of each hymn, it does help to provide another dynamic to the church.

At long last the East Riding Ringing Centre was able to hold a couple of workshops for Bob Doubles & Plain Hunting, both workshops were fully booked, we even had to turn away a few of the late bookers from one of them!! These are long days but in a good way and the feed back I get is always very positive from those who have attended. The workshops would not run so smoothly without the help from a hard core of experienced ringers, so thank you all and especially Helen Audley.

We have a full programme of training workshops planned for 2022 alone with some exciting news about the Ringing Centre planned for mid-March 2022!!!

In late December we were able to reinstate our Winter Ramble where around twenty-five of us visited and rang at Snaith, Hemingbrough, Goole and Easington finishing off the day with an evening meal and social gathering at the Zoom Café Bar which included a pool knock out tournament.

Finally, a big thank you to everyone who has supported us during 2020 which includes the lovely comments we receive personally and on the Community Facebook page from the North Cave residents and of course to the Rev Barry Worsdale and our Church Wardens for their continued support.

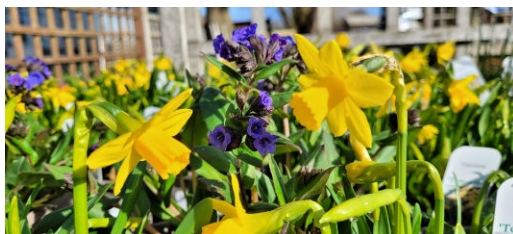

Countryside Concerns

Spring at last, complete with blue skies and sunshine. It's a pleasure to be out and about after the long dark days of winter. The hedges are showing signs of greenery and blossom of all description is another welcome sight as is the hazel catkins that have been out since the end of January. The snowdrops have given us another marvellous display, as they always do. Its our first harbinger of spring and is very much revered by the Druids who planted them in their sacred groves. As with the daisy, the snowdrop is governed by the day length and opens its petals at ten and closes them at four. Herbalists too found a use for it and crushed the bulbs to make a reliable cure for frostbite and chilblains. Our modern day specialists are using an extract from them to treat Glaucoma. In the language of flowers the snowdrop means - Renewal 'I make a fresh bid for your affection'. The very opposite to the aconite - Dislike, "Your attentions are unwelcome"; whereas the crocus counters that with Youthful Joy, "My heart rejoices in you", the Sweet Violet stands for Modesty, "As pure as this sweet flower are you". Whoever thought all these flowery meanings up must have had a lot of time on their hands to put the Jonquil and Daffodil head to head - Jonquil is for Petition, "Please answer soon. Dare I hope you love me", whereas the haughty Daffodil is for Rebuttal and replies "I do not share your feelings". True love certainly treads a tricky path and can soon

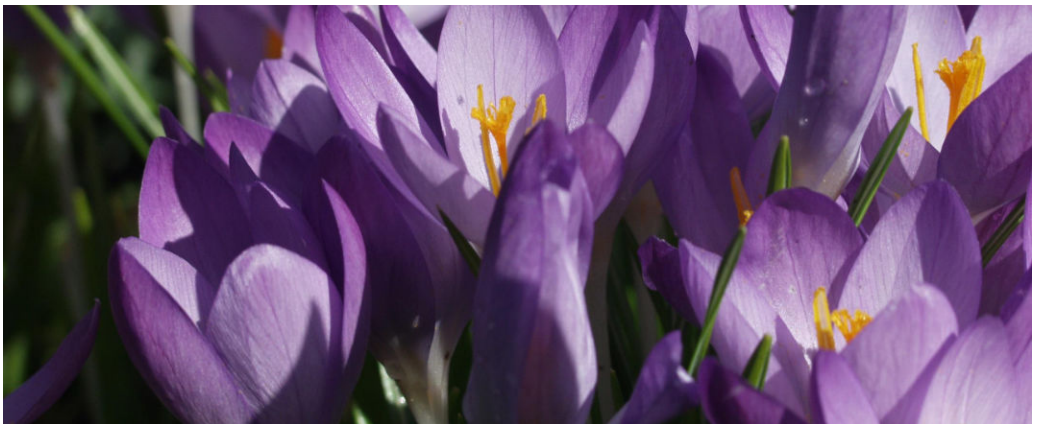
end with a clip round the ear rather than a peck on the cheek!

Down on the allotments, the warm sunshine is awakening the weed seeds, soon to burst forth to antagonise the gardener but rather than kill them, why not eat them. Young dandelion leaves can be added to your salad should you wish to be a bit adventurous and are a pick-me-up for the kidneys, liver and circulation, as well as being drunk as a tea for the relief of Arthritis. 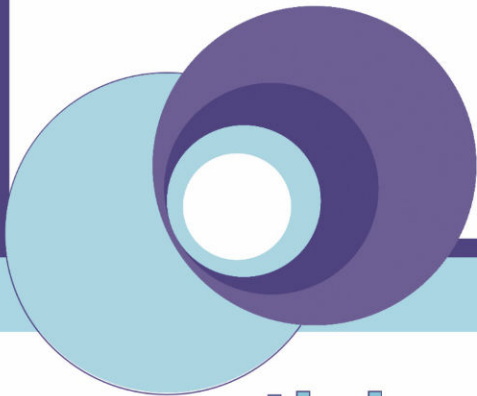
