

Queen's Jubilee Celebrations

Plans for the celebrations of the Queen's Jubilee are on target for the 5th June as you will have seen from the notices displayed around the village. Although this event is being run independently of NCPC, we have been quite heavily involved and have provided some funds to cover a shortfall amounting to £500 in addition to our previous donation.

NCPC has provided funding for Queen's Jubilee mugs which will be given to the children at North Cave Primary School. There will be some spare mugs available which will be on sale at the NCPC stall during the celebrations on the 5th June at North Cave Playing Fields.

Tree Planting

DEFRA are providing funding for two tree planting schemes. As a delivery partner for DEFRA, The Conservation Volunteers have offered the village the funding for new trees as part of the local community forest (Humber Forest) and will also carry out the planting. We are currently working with this group, and the WI who have also offered to fund some trees, to determine the feasibility and most suitable locations.

We have recently been joined by a new Councillor, Wendy Elliott of Everthorpe. It is good that the village of Everthorpe has input to the NCPC meetings and we hope you will join us in welcoming Wendy to this role.

Update for Early Summer 2022

Funding

It is looking very likely that we will be receiving Environment Agency funding for project management, feasibility work, and some site-based interventions this year. The 'business case' is submitted and we'll be pursuing opportunities as they become available.

Strategic Projects

- 1 Watercourse management We had a great meeting with experts of University of Hull Biology Department who are keen to work with WWSTF. They want to help us, along with East Yorkshire Rivers Trust (EYRT) and Yorkshire Wildlife Trust (YWT), to develop a community programme based around our chalk streams. So if you would like to know more about our unique natural heritage, keep in touch (see below).
- 2 Natural Flood Management (NFM) Another meeting with some UK experts gave us a lot of pointers about how best to implement NFM in our catchment.
- **3 Agriculture** The Agriculture Workshop event we mentioned last time (soil management, carbon capture, tree planting etc.) is planned for June at Drewton Manor Rooms, and funded by Yorkshire Water. The date is not yet fixed, so please check our new forum (notice below) where we will publish ASAP. Alternatively, just get in touch directly by email to be notified as soon as we have the date. **All farmers/landowners welcome**.
- 4 Data capture Discussions ongoing!
- **5 Waste and Surface water** Yorkshire Water's consultants, Stantec, recently joined the WWSTF Technical Group meeting for the first time. Hopefully, this is the start of a more effective relationship with YW.
- **6 Schools** After our successful sessions with North Cave Primary, the first meeting has been set up with head and staff at Newbald Primary School. South Cave to follow in due course.

Site Specific Projects

The main update of interest is that we walked around Littlemoor Drain/Finkle St/Blanshards Lane with ERYC Flood Risk, to help them understand the locality and what measures would help to reduce the surface water flooding in these areas of North Cave. ERYC has also submitted its 'business case' so, if successful, there should be some action on the ground during this financial year.

Perhaps of limited interest to North Cave area readers, but we have also had some very positive site meetings with Ellerker Parish Council and landowners above Ellerker, which we think could result in projects which will really help reduce the issues experienced along Main Street in Ellerker.

Similarly, we have had very positive meetings and contacts with Newbald Parish Council and landowners. When local and technical experts get together, great things are possible!

Hotham 1944

The second world war was at its height and still had over a year to run before peace would be declared. Holme-on-Spalding Moor airfield was home to the Halifax bombers of 76 Squadron and were doing their bit to defend our country. Taking off from a flat airfield and getting up and over the Wolds would be testing for any pilot with a heavy bomb load and so it was when on the evening of January 21st at 20.05 hrs a Mk.V Halifax LK630 took off heading for Magdeburg near Berlin; 20 minutes into the flight the aircraft iced up, forcing the plane to lose height and eventually crash in fields close to the village on the northern edge of Hotham. Six of the crew baled out but the young British 21 year old pilot died at the controls. This was the first of two Halifax bombers to crash at Hotham.

On the 23rd June a Mk.3 Halifax LW620 was on its return flight from a night raid on railway yards at Laon in occupied France when the inner port engine overheated and was shut down by the Flight Engineer who also feathered the propeller to allow cold air to pass through. It is believed the damage was caused by friendly fire, resulting in the steady loss of oil. As they neared their base at HOSM attempts were made to restart the engine but

it seized up, causing the propeller and gearbox to shear off, penetrate the cockpit and killing the pilot instantly. At 03.20 it crashed into farm buildings on the eastern side of the village killing all seven Canadian crew. The pilot was a 25 year old from Moosejaw, Saskatchewan and the youngest crew member was only 20 years old.

The ARP Warden for Hotham was William (Bill) Neale who despite living at the bottom of the village was one of the first people to arrive at the crash site to attempt the rescue of any survivors, all crew were pulled from the wreckage but one sadly died in Bills arms. All the air crews at HOSM were made up of British and Canadian, all young men in the prime of their lives and all willing to pay the price of war. There are never any winners in war, even the victors are left with heartache and sad memories. As the residents of our villages change, the history they hold should be known by all and I think it would be a fitting gesture if a way could be found to commemorate these two brave air crews, in some shape or form.

It's been 6 weeks or so since we had any decent amount of rain but despite the cold, dry spring the blossom has been quite spectacular. Having said that, anyone thinking of giving a bouquet of blossoms to a friend has to get things in the right order or they may end up in the bin and the flowers too! Blackthorn or Sloe is usually the first to make its appearance but comes with a warning; Obstacles - "Problems lie ahead" but the Magnolia is for Courage; "Be not disheartened, better days are due", Hawthorn chips in with Hope; despite your answer, I shall strive for your love" and a sprinkling of Almond blossom signifies Hope; "I am beginning to enjoy your friendship" to which Apple blossom replies "You are no less good than you are fair", a sprinkling of Oak leaves says "Love will find a way" and Cherry blossom smiles and says "May our friendship wax firm and strong", Purple Lilac for Spring Love gently takes your hand and says "You are my first love and with a sprig of White Lilac of Innocence ends with "You are an emblem of purity and beauty" - and so the spring romance begins - but maybe summer flowers could upset the apple cart, who knows?

It's mid-April and with warm spring sunshine but cold winds, I wait for the arrival of the first Swallow and sure enough I get a text from Newport saying "We have just one Swallow on our telephone wire". Sadly the cold easterly wind sent it back down south but with warmer weather it will soon be back and low and behold on April 29th I saw two in Hotham. I just hope they can find enough insects in this cool weather.

A disturbing report in the paper said that the Asian Hornet has been making an appearance around East Anglia, probably blown over from France with the east winds and has already put bee-keepers on "Red Alert" as just one of these predators can catch and consume 50 of our honey bees in one day.

Our Hedgehog has put in an appearance at last and left us a few calling cards to say "hello". Sadly I have already seen two corpses on the roads - one in North Cave and one coming into Newport. With these creatures only making an appearance at night, it makes me wonder why drivers can't apply their brakes more frequently, it isn't as though there's heavy traffic about, after all they are an endangered species and we should value their survival more.
