

Chalk streams

One of the great things about working on WWSTF is that there is so much to learn; and working with experts from various agencies and organisations, there are many people to learn from.

I have often said that WWSTF is all about the chalk streams in our little catchment, which runs from Newbald, through Hotham, North Cave, South Cave and Ellerker.

But on a tour of the catchment with a couple of colleagues from the Environment Agency a few weeks ago, I learned that it is not quite so simple. The streams that emerge as springs from the chalk are obviously chalk streams examples include Ings Beck in Newbald (which becomes Hotham and then North Cave Beck), Drewton Beck which runs into North Cave, South Cave Beck and Ellerker Beck. But not all becks and watercourses in our area arise from chalk springs.

When we went to look at Ferry Beck, at the back of West End, South Cave, it was completely dry, unlike all the other becks we had seen during the day, which had been running strongly, despite the prolonged drought. I was surprised, but my EA colleague pointed out that it is not a chalk stream: it drains the land from around South Cave golf course and south of Everthorpe and, although it has caused flooding in the past, equally it can dry out when there is no rain.

The same is true of Littlemoor Drain. When we took North Cave School pupils to see it in the spring, across the road from their school gates, they were excited to see the water skaters on its surface. Two weeks ago it was dry.

Similarly, the chalk stream that runs down Little Wold Lane, to join South Cave beck, is 'winterbourne' - which means that although it can run steadily and well during the winter, it does dry out in the summer, if the water table drops below the base of the stream.

So, although all of these short-lived becks and

drains have a value for wildlife, as well as their drainage function, it is limited by the fact that no species which need water all year round are going to survive in them.

Which brings us back to chalk streams. Because they are fed by water from the chalk aquifer, they are very much more constant than 'ordinary' streams. They start off clear and clean, because they are filtered by the chalk. Their rate of flow, mineral content and temperature of the water is much steadier throughout the year than that of other watercourses. These properties make them rich in insect, fish and plant life, provided they are not polluted and they do not suffer too much from water abstraction or land drainage.

No wonder then, that they are regarded as the UK's "unique contribution to global ecology".

Our East Yorkshire chalk streams are some of the best in the UK. The becks that run so constantly through our villages are vitally important habitats. Whilst we try to plan and protect ourselves from the worst effects of flooding, we should also be very aware of their beauty, importance and fragility, and realise how lucky we are to have a 'unique contribution to global ecology' running right through our villages.

The other great experts on the becks are, of course, those people who live and work around them. You know about their wildlife, when they are healthy and when they are not, how they flow, and when they are a problem. We would love you to share what you have seen and what you know, so do get in touch contacts above.

North Cave Bell Ringing Summer Review

On the first of June we officially launched the East Riding School of Bell Ringing, this new venture now runs the already well-established East Riding Ringing Centre and ART Training Hub at North Cave but we now have the newly formed Bubwith Ringing Centre within the school. The bells and Bubwith have been totally refurbished this year with a new bell being added to making them into a ringing of six in what is very much a brand-new installation At the North Cave Centre we have found that most of our full day workshops were being over subscribed so we were actually having to turn some people away, which is not what we are all about, so the new Centre provides with extra training capacity along with a larger capture area. Both Centres are equally equipped with classrooms, computerised ringing simulators, projectors, kitchens, and toilet facilities. It was very pleasing to have Simon Linford the President of the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers (CCCBR) mention our efforts within one of his Blogs Simon's Blogs get posted to every corner of the world, so this provided us a nice bit of free exposure.

For the Platinum Jubilee we rang a quarter peal for HM Queen Elizabeth II prior to the morning Songs of Praise service at All Saints, following the service we rang again prior to the start of the village Jubilee celebrations.

Also in early June, Jill Marwood held a bingo night in aide of the North Cave Bell Ringers at the Village Hall, a few of the ringers attended the event and had a very enjoyable evening. It must be said that Jill and her team run a very slick and well organised fund-raising evening and we were overwhelmed to be presented with £750 a few days later. Jill and team, along with everyone who attended, thank you all very much.

We shall be competing in the Yorkshire Association annual Striking Competition very soon up in Cleveland, this is when ringing bands from other churches throughout Yorkshire all gather and ring about a ten-minute test piece. Each test piece is then independently judged outside as it is being rung, the judges have no idea the order of the bands. The judges then announce who in their opinion rang with the least number of faults. Wish us luck as we could be up against the likes of York Minster, Ripon Cathedral and Leeds minster etc...

Our Tuesday practice nights continue to be very well attended, averaging at least 15 ringers within the chamber each week. The progress being made by all has been very pleasing indeed, along with the high standard of ringing that is consistently being achieved by our Sunday Service and wedding bands.

There is a Beverley & District Quarter Peal award that is presented annually to the church that rings

the highest number of quarter peals (QP's) within a year, and award that Escrick has claimed for the past eleven years, we now find ourselves in a bit of a head-to-head with Escrick, with the totals, as I write standing at, North Cave 26, Escrick 25!!

At last, we are back ringing on a best set of bell ropes, we have been ringing on our spare set for a while as we had to send our number one set down to Mendip Ropes in Somerset for refurbishment. This set is not very old but with the amount of ringing and training we do at All Saints they do not have the same life span as other towers. Our aim is to invest in a complete new set of ropes thus providing us with a very good number set as well as our original spare ones.


To mark the passing of HM Queen Elizabeth II, on Friday 9th September at noon, we rang half muffled, this was a national ringing event which formed part of Operation London Bridge and over the weekend of 10/11th September we then rang with the bells full open to mark the Proclamation of the Accession of King Charles III at St James Palace. On Thursday 15th September we rang a half-muffled quarter in memory of HM Queen Elizabeth II

Looking forwards, in November the North Cave ringers will be making their second ringing trip overseas when we visit the Anglican church of St George at Vernet-les-Bains located up in the Pyrenees. These are a new ring of ten bells and the only ring of bells in France that can be rung in the style of English full circle change ringing. While over there, our programme is to have some general ringing, a Quarter Peal and then join the local band at their practice along with a service ringing on the Sunday. We are so blessed to have healthy numbers at North Cave, in fact, the timings have worked out so that North Cave ringers will be ringing at the same time for two different Sunday Services in two different countries. To finish I would like to thank the following, the Revd Barry Worsdale and the Church Wardens for their continued support, for the very kind comments we received on the Community Facebook page, the support from our friends in the White Hart, Mike Morton for looking after our Stays and the Village Link.

The crest for our new school: the zigzag lines in the middle are called a method and these are what we need to learn to ring. This particular one is called Hardwick Double - composed especially for Geoff Hardwick our Ringing Master and Tower Captain for 55 years, so we thought was very appropriate to have on our new crest.

North Cave in Bloom members will be removing the summer bedding and planting many spring flowering bulbs including crocus, tulips, miniature and standard daffodils and white anemone. We will also add wallflowers as these seem quite hardy and long lasting.

Our new wooden planter, kindly constructed by one of our members, John North, and sponsored by Adams and Green Ltd, formerly Brocklesby's, is now in place in Nordham near to the entrance to the park. Countryside Concerns

This year our countryside has had many challenges to face, starting with a dry winter, spring and summer it was little wonder that our trees experienced a 'false autumn' and started to shed their leaves in order to conserve water. When the September rain did arrive there was a noticeable change in their appearance as leaves looked glossier and berries plumped up. But despite all the dry weather not everything suffered and many fruits bore abundant crops with brambles, sloes, plums and damsons keeping many ladies busy making jams, jellies and gins in every flavour imaginable and all to be readily sampled around the end of the year.

In early summer our garden birds seemed hungrier than ever and even their fledglings put aside the fear of humans in order to take advantage of the extra food. I even saw a young blackbird begging a starling to feed it and surprise, surprise the starling obliged! Sadly the two hedgehogs that visited last year haven't put in an appearance as yet, but a friend in Newport still has two that call every night around dusk to clean out the cat dishes and hoover up the cat biscuits. Another friend in Walkington has two and sometimes three that come round every night for the cat biscuits sprinkled on the lawn. It's good to know that more and more people are doing their best to save our entertaining hogs.



It would be nice to report some good news about our Swifts but this year they have suffered badly through householders replacing their wooden fascia boards with plastic boards which has stopped the swifts getting into their nest site, which they return to year on year. The problem is that they are unable to grip onto the plastic because it is too smooth. They are so desperate to get under the eaves and try repeatedly until they end up falling to the ground exhausted and bleeding and if they aren't rescued they eventually die as they are unable to take off from the ground due to their tiny legs. (They would have no trouble at all if some twit hadn't invented plastic! the bane of every living thing on our planet). Thank goodness for all our Wildlife Rescue Centres who have reported their greatest number of baby chicks of all three members of swifts, swallows and martins, easily out-numbering all other fledglings they receive but, being the dedicated people they are, they managed to get the majority of them through to their eventual release in time to join the adults on their long journey home.

With September comes fresher weather and much longed for rain, we can breathe easier and reflect on how we can prepare ourselves, should this year's events become the norm. Oh how I long for my childhood years when you could rely on the seasons of spring being warm, summer warm to hot, autumn cool and winter cold - with SNOW and everything followed a pattern. Happy Days!
