Data Capture

Data Capture - sounds dull, doesn't it? Or a bit like something that Google does when you search online. In the case of WWSTF, it means collecting and keeping records which help us to understand our weather, and what that weather means for flooding and the condition of our becks and watercourses.

We knew from the start that we would need to do this. Not only can it show us what flooding we might expect from heavy rain and storms, in time we can build up a record so that we can see patterns in the weather. And if we create **Natural Flood Management (NFM)** features around the West Wolds Catchment, it might give us an idea how much difference they make. If a certain size storm event in 2022 results in the beck rising to a particular height, what does a similar event look like in 2027 or 2032, after **NFM** has been installed? (Yes, we are in this for the long haul!)

Quite early on, this idea was picked up by our partners, the **University of Hull**, who have lots of expertise in this sort of thing. We are delighted to say that, not only have they found funding for our first installations, and provided the technical expertise, but our first weather station is installed and online, at **North Cave Primary School**.

The weather station is mentioned in the **School Link** this month on Page 6. Not only are they hosting the weather station for us, but they are using it in their Geography and other classes. If you want to know more, or to find out exactly what the weather is doing right now, go to the school page here: <https://northcave-school.co.uk/weather-station/>

But it gets better. The data is being not just displayed for the day, but captured. If you go to this website <https://tinyurl.com/3xx4hz4t> it will take you to the 'Wunderground' page where all the records are shown since installation. Go to 'Weather History', select Daily, Weekly or Monthly mode, and the period you want to look at, and it is all there in the

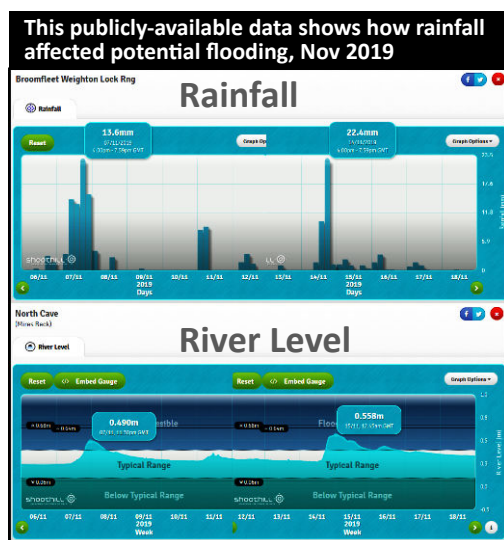
graphs. In case you are wondering - that heavy rain we had in mid-November was about 31.5mm over 24 hours.

To understand what effect the weather has, we are also installing **river level and flow rate gauges**, one at North Cave and one at Newbald - more on this in a future issue.

And we hope this is just the start, with ambitions to have a weather station at each of our local primary schools, and river monitors on all of our major becks, and perhaps some smaller drains which are sensitive to flooding.

We have put in a further funding bid to University of Hull's **Flood Innovation Centre** to help move us towards this ambition, working with **East Yorkshire Rivers Trust**. **Newbald Parish Council** has also suggested that its wind farm fund could pay for the costs of some equipment in Newbald. Other contributions are welcome! Eventually we hope to host all of the information on our website, so that everyone can access it in one place.

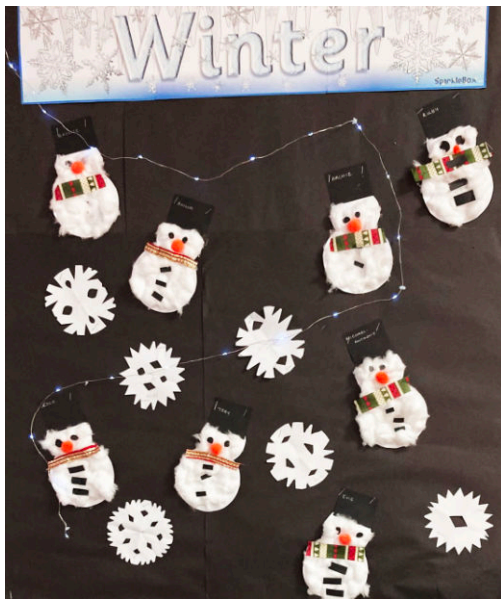

Local Coordination Service

East Riding of Yorkshire Council is proud to be working with The British Red Cross to provide the Local Coordination Service across the East Riding. This new service aims to support and empower vulnerable and elderly residents who may be isolated, to rebuild their confidence, access their community and improve their wellbeing.

Staff at The British Red Cross are skilled and dedicated in helping people to live independently and confidently in their neighbourhood. They take the time to get to know an individual and to understand the challenges that they may be facing. The coordinator will then work with the individual and establish what they would like to change, their goals and how they can achieve them.

Who can make a referral to the service?

Anyone! Family, friends, neighbours, volunteers or professionals who are concerned about an elderly or vulnerable resident in the East Riding, can make a referral to the service.

What happens when a referral to the service is made?

- The coordinator will ask permission to take some details and add them to their secure British Red Cross data

system so they can contact the individual and record their work with that person.

- Where necessary they will coordinate any additional support from a range of health and social care professionals and community resources to help get the right level of support at the right time.
- The coordinator can help with accessing old and new hobbies, community groups, family and friends that they may have lost contact with due to an episode of ill health or vulnerability through Covid.

North Cave Bell Ringing

Bell Ringers on Tour



St George, Vernet-Les-Bains

Over the weekend of 18th-20th November a group of North Cave ringers travelled to ring at Vernet-Les-Bains in the south of France, a new ring of ten bells installed in 2019 and the only ring of bells in France that can be rung in the English style of full circle change ringing. Ryanair brought our departure time forward to 6.10am from Manchester, but this provided us with a full day of exploring on our drive down from Carcassonne to Vernet though the mountains.

We had our first ring on the bells on Friday evening; this was really so we could get used to this new ten ahead of a full day of ringing on Saturday. We held some general ringing on the Saturday morning with some of the local ringers then, following lunch, we scored two quarter peals, with the first being the first quarter peal to be rung in France for the Beverley & District Ringing Society. This follows on nicely from when the North Cave ringers scored the first overseas quarter peal for the society in Ypres back in 2018. Both of the Vernet Quarter Peals were important in other respects, with Pete Shingles and Richard Carter ringing their first Quarter Peals on eight bells and Harvey Plows conducting his first on eight.

On the evening we joined the Vernet ringers for their weekly practice, this gave us chance to give something back as they are a new band and they

have come on so well since 2019 even more so when you consider the lack of ringing during the pandemic. Ringers for both bands then ended the day with curry and wine. A midday flight back home on the Sunday meant they we couldn't join the Vernet ringers for their morning service ring.

They made us so welcome with many new friendships being formed, we shall return.

This weekend showed the strength in depth of the North Cave band, as while some of us were ringing, wining and dining in the South of France, we still held a ringing event on the Saturday morning at All Saints for fifteen under 18 ringers from all over the East Riding as well as having a full band for the Sunday service.

Ring for the King

For hundreds of years church bells have rung out, not only to call

communities to worship, but also to celebrate special occasions, in remembrance of others and to signify special events. They are part of the

soundscape of the UK. In June 2022 we all celebrated Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee with the sound of bells. Bells also rang out with a muffled sound throughout the nation as a mark of respect at her passing in September 2022.

Following the announcement of King Charles' Coronation, the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers has initiated an appeal to recruit more ringers so they are trained in time to Ring for the King.

Countryside Concerns

Mid-November and at last the month has changed back to what a typical autumn should be... grey misty days, wind, prolonged rain showers and even a touch of frost. I think it is the dark mornings and evenings that we dread the most, but at least we did get our lovely colours of autumn in our trees and hedgerows which are still laden with berries, most of which have usually been eaten by Fieldfares and Redwings coming in from Europe but, so far, haven't shown up yet. This morning at just gone 6a.m. I opened the door to see if it was wet or dry and I could hear a Blackbird singing away as if it was the start of spring. We usually have a Robin serenading us from the bush by the window at this time of year, but so far he hasn't put in an appearance. We are getting daily visits from Magpies (6 yesterday) - something we haven't had before. Later that day I was just about to shoo a Sparrow Hawk off the back fence when two Magpies landed, one on either side of it. The hawk didn't fly off but the maggies tried to intimidate it to no avail, one even went behind it and tweaked its tail feather but still didn't get a reaction and eventually flew off to find something else to hassle. Being an ace predator I thought the hawk would have been a bit more feisty but, thinking about it, maybe he would have been mobbed and not lived another day to return and pick another of our Goldfinches off. Apparently the collective noun for a gathering of Magpies is (a mischief).

Driving home through Hook, the fields are usually empty and bare but this particularly large stubble field was absolutely covered in wild geese, there must have been two or three hundred and would have made a super photo had there been a chance to stop. With the weather being so mild of late, my friends' Hedgehogs are still active and call round now and then for a supper of cat food and biscuits. Even though my friends don't have any pets of

their own, they make sure there is always water and food for any passing stray.

Our bees seem to have a non-stop battle for survival, if it isn't the Asian Hornet picking them off or the neonicotinoid sprays (which are not entirely banned here), they, like us, are having to cope with climate change; which, over the past 50 years, has shortened their life cycle from one month to two weeks. A local bee keeper has had a particular vexing problem with his honey being a dark colour and not setting, even though it is still good to eat. This has happened the last two years and despite exploring every possible explanation the mystery still remains. Any ideas anybody? Could it be a new crop being grown? Maybe it could be the abundant Privet hedge blossom we had this year which is said to taint honey or even the growing of medicinal Cannabis? Who knows! Even our lives have changed quite a lot this year too and now we are facing situations like the period after the war, when austerity really had a bite. Make do and mend will be a blast from the past for some of us and grow your own fruit and veg will be very satisfying for young and old alike. It's amazing what you can grow in a large plant pot. Peat-free compost has not had a very good press with some of the top seed growers having problems with germination but having thought long and hard about this problem, I am going to try mixing my own recipe with soil collected from mole-hills because, it doesn't matter whether you love or hate them, they do provide lovely weed-free soil. So when you have an idle hour or two to spare on a weekend, get the kids out with a bucket and trowel and get them growing their own!

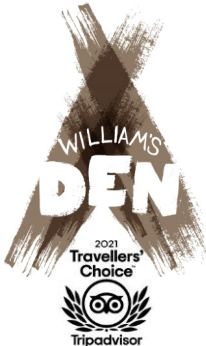

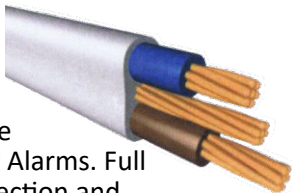
