Update - Winter-Spring 2023

The following is a summary of an email update recently sent to contacts and partners of WWSTF. If you would like any more details, get in touch.

Site proposals and Design Workshops

There are a number of sites around the catchment where the landowners/trustees are willing discuss Natural Flood Management (NFM). The first step will be to bring together a range of our expert partners with the landowners/farmers in design workshops. These will involve site meetings, followed by indoor workshops where all parties can contribute to reviewing design options and approaches. These will take into account flood mitigation, biodiversity, planting opportunities and longer-term management at the following sites:

• Pratt Wood at Newbald (with Trustees, including Newbald Parish Councillors)

• Drewton Farm (west of the A1034) and Mill Farm Everthorpe which, together, make up a notable length of Drewton Beck.

• Land above Mill House, Ellerker.

In addition to the above, we understand that ERYC has been successful in its bid to include NFM in flood mitigation works along Littlemoor Drain in North Cave, and we look forward to working with them through WWSTF to help develop the design in 2023.

We also met with ERYC Officers in December to look at the Ferry Beck catchment above West End, South Cave, and hope to develop proposals with them during 2023, together with a number of other sites around the catchment.

NFM Design and Management

WWSTF has been working with ERYC and other groups to develop a strategic approach to NFM - in particular who takes responsibility for design and management. We hosted a meeting in December with ERYC, EA and others, including an officer of Stroud District Council, which receives funding for NFM through the Regional Flood and Coastal Committee (RFCC). This is a model which could fund NFM and other measures in East Yorkshire without placing additional strain upon the local authority budget. There was wide support in the meeting for this approach, including from EA reps who have responsibility on the RFCC. The potential of this approach extends beyond the WWSTF area to the whole of East Yorkshire.

DEFRA Capital Grants for NFM

We started 2023 with helpful news of a a greater focus on funding for NFM through DEFRA Rural Payments system. There has been a new NFM category added to the range of capital grants, with a maximum of £20,000 available per landowner to use on NFM measures such as disrupting tramlines in arable areas and creating leaky woody dams. We will work with the Catchment Sensitive Farming (CSF) Farm Adviser to encourage access to this funding in our area.

School Rain Garden Planters

Between now and end of March we will be working on proposals for, and implementation of, rain garden planters at North Cave and South Cave Primary Schools. These planters intercept and attenuate storm water from the school roofs by diverting the rainwater pipes. They have the capacity to hold a volume of water before they fill up, when the excess water runs into the drain as usual.

Whilst they will not make a big impact on the amount of surface water running off the school roofs, they illustrate the principles of slowing the flow very well as well as providing attractive, educational features for the pupils to be involved in. They may also be the first small step in reviewing the school estates to see what else can be done to slow the flow.

Data Capture

As reported in the last Village Link, we have an ambitious programme of data capture, looking at rainfall and its effects on our watercourses, including flooding. The first weather station has been installed at North Cave Primary School, and the first two river level/flow cameras have recently been installed at North Cave Beck and Newbald/Ings Beck. We have also made a successful funding bid to the Sober Hill Wind Farm Fund for sensors to be install at Newbald Becksies and connected to Newbald Primary school.

We aim to develop the sensor network across the catchment and will be pursuing this over the coming years. Particular thanks go to Dr Stuart McLelland and colleagues at University of Hull for their expertise and for obtaining the funding thus far.

Finally

We also aim to develop two Strategic projects this year, 'Surface/Waste Water' and 'Watercourse Management, Biodiversity & Water Quality'. We look forward to working with Yorkshire Water and University of Hull / East Yorkshire Rivers Trust, in particular, on these themes.

We know full well that we don't have all the answers. That being the case, our main role is to keep asking questions until answers emerge - so all questions are welcome!

East Riding of Yorkshire Council is proud to be working with The British Red Cross to provide the Local Coordination Service across the East Riding. This new service aims to support and empower vulnerable and elderly residents who may be isolated, to rebuild their confidence, access their community and improve their wellbeing.

Staff at The British Red Cross are skilled and dedicated in helping people to live independently and confidently in their neighbourhood. They take the time to get to know an individual and to understand the challenges that they may be facing. The coordinator will then work with the individual and establish what they would like to change, their goals and how they can achieve them.

Who can make a referral to the service?

Anyone! Family, friends, neighbours, volunteers or professionals who are concerned about an elderly or vulnerable resident in the East Riding, can make a referral to the service.

What happens when a referral to the service is made?

 The coordinator will ask permission to take some details and add them to their secure British Red Cross data



system so they can contact the individual and record their work with that person.

- Where necessary they will coordinate any additional support from a range of health and social care professionals and community resources to help get the right level of support at the right time.
- The coordinator can help with accessing old and new hobbies, community groups, family and friends that they may have lost contact with due to an episode of ill health or vulnerability through Covid.

North Cave Bell Ringing

On the stroke of midnight on the 31st December we tolled our tenor bell, on its 12th toll it was then joined by the remaining bells for ten minutes of ringing to welcome in the new year.

What a busy and exciting year 2022 had been for the North Cave Bell ringers. Our primary role is obviously to support the church and its activities, so apart from our regular service ringing the bells were also rung for Weddings, Remembrance, Memorial services, Easter, Harvest, Church open garden weekend and prior to the Live Nativity event.

It was nice to receive a request from outside of the church for the bells to be rung as the "backing track" for Santa's visit and tour around the village.

Following the Harvest Auction within the White Hart back in September we were surprised and honoured to receive £270 from this event towards our bell repair fund, this fund is used to provide general maintenance for the bells and this money I think has been ring fenced for painting of the bell frame during the summer months. Our thanks go to Sharron and Sam at the White Hart along with everyone one who attended the Harvest Auction, it was a great night.

Between Christmas and New Year we always hold a mini ringing tour, we always try and keep this fairly local due to possible weather conditions, so in December around 25 of us headed out to ring at Holme on Spalding Moor, Bubwith, Barnby Moor, Pocklington and Nunburnholme, surprise, surprise we ended the day in the White Hart where Sharron had prepared us a lovely tea followed by what has become our annual pool knockout tournament.

Our greatest achievement as a band last year was to finally win the Joan Castle Memorial Trophy, this is a trophy presented by the Beverley & District Ringing Society to the band that rings the most quarter peals within the year, a trophy that has been held by Escrick for the previous twelve years. A quarter peal is, as it suggests, a quarter of a full peal, which means we have to ring 1260 changes which on average take around 45 minutes on our bells. The final total for the top two was North Cave with 46 and Escrick with 39. Well done team.

The East Riding School of Bell Ringing which we formed last year as a progression and expansion of the East Riding Ringing Centre has already started its busy schedule of training workshops for the first quarter of 2023. 7th January saw the first workshop to be held at our new Ringing Centre at Bubwith, this was a full day event and I am pleased to report that it was fully booked. The 21st January is the date of our second workshop, this one being held at the East Riding Ringing Centre at North Cave, again this is fully booked, with ringers from the Scarborough and Cleveland & North Yorkshire branches of the Yorkshire Association taking full advantage of our training facilities.

To finish I would like to thank the Revd Barry Worsdale and the Church Wardens for their continued support, the very kind comments we receive on the Community Facebook page and the support from our friends and fellow punters in the White Hart.

Countryside Concerns

It's so nice to see the afternoons getting a cock-stride lighter each passing day, especially if we manage to get some warm sunshine in between the never-ending showers that we seem to have had forever. but at least we can be grateful that we haven't had the snow blizzards, torrential rain and devastating floods that America is still having. Every day brings us a bit closer to spring and already snowdrops are coming into bloom and the hazel bushes are dripping with catkins and soon we will be looking for the first lambs and green shoots on the hedgerows. With our seasons being so unpredictable, there have been some unusual animals turning up on our shores. Thor the walrus, found around the arctic circle, made a visit to Scarborough and hauled out on the harbour slipway on New Year's Eve to the delight of some residents but to the annoyance of others as they had to cancel the annual firework display, before waving a flipper and heading off for Blyth in Northumberland where he stayed for another day and then headed north towards home.

I wonder if it was the same one that appeared in Wales earlier last year. Maybe he will come back for another visit around Christmas time but who would have thought we would ever see one this far south. Thor wasn't the only animal to reach our shores, I never imagined a baby Loggerhead turtle would be rescued on the shores of cold Atlantic was a miracle anyway.

The Woodland Trust bought the 346-acre Victory Wood near Whitstable in Kent in 2004 and over the years they have turned it back to woodland, scrub and grassland. Their efforts have been rewarded by the return of a rare bumble bee - the shrill carder bee, so named for its high-pitched buzz and the site is one of only five sites in the country.

I got a call from friends in Newport in December to say that the Goosanders had arrived back on the canal, also during the cold snap they saw Kingfishers, Herons and various wildfowl seeking food as the local fishing ponds were iced up. We also had extra mouths to feed and the bird feeders were getting filled twice a day to keep up with demand.

On the odd days when the weather allows, a quick visit to the allotment gardens at Hotham allows us to replenish the water butts ready for another super-hot summer and tidy up a bit for the coming season. Having posted off my seed order, I can't wait to get down and dirty! Don't forget to keep collecting the molehill soil to mix with your compost, they are very busy at the moment so don't miss the opportunity to get some weed-free soil.
