Countryside Concerns

Growing up in the 1950's, the countryside was our playground and in Hotham the number of school-age children was over 30, there were 8 farms and about as many smallholdings. We were all brought up to respect people, property, fields and woods, which we did, while still having a whale of a time in the fresh air. In the school holidays we were almost feral, out in mid-morning and home before tea, spending our days climbing trees, paddling in the streams catching sticklebacks, doing arrow chases, paper trails, fox and hounds, cowboys and Indians and exploring woods and countryside. Everything had its seasonal toys and games, starting off with tennis balls, then skipping ropes followed by hula hoops, roller skates, marbles, ball and jack, kick can, block, tig and statues - where you were spun round holding hands until you were dizzy and had to freeze in the position you were in when they let go of you. We never got bored, we hadn't time, life was an adventure – more so when motor bikes entered our lives!

Fast forward 70 years and children of today wouldn't have a clue what you were on about. We could name wild flowers, identify birds by their song and name all the trees. But, if you ask children to tell you the colour of a stitchwort flower, they would, no doubt have to look it up on their mobile for the answer. Everything seems to involve technology these days, which wasn't about in our childhood. If you wanted to call anyone you had to go to the phone box at middle of the village. But speed and greed took over our halcyon days and we never thought that in those 70 years the human population would bring our wonderful planet to the brink of disaster. Thank goodness we have people like Sir David Attenborough, who has done his utmost to bring to light the desperate situation our actions have had on our once perfect world.

But it's not all doom and gloom, at least we have the means to put things right - it's only time we lack. Replanting hedgerows and joining up wildlife corridors have had a massive effect for our insects and wildlife in general to slowly help things come back to

life again. More farmland birds are coming back, ponds are being dug, bringing back insect life, wider field margins allowing wildflowers to flourish, feeding the insects which feed the birds and the circle of life restarts. The Forestry Commission has come to realise that the vast areas of fir trees they planted for the timber industry killed off all plant life in them; as nothing could grow in such dark, acid conditions, but now that they have started to grow mixed woodland with our native hard woods and fir trees together. The woodland floor is starting to return to its



original pattern of bluebells, primroses, windflowers and wild garlic etc and with it returns the insects and bird-life to complete nature's circle. Hurray to that - common sense is not dead after all - or is it?

Despite all the negative reasons the green energy producers give us - could they give us a satisfactory explanation as to why we haven't got tidal energy surrounding our island? Surely with two tides guaranteed every day it's got to make sense to harness this clean, green energy and it's much friendlier than the scary nuclear type. That word has always bothered me and why do so many people mis-pronounce it, some say 'newkiller' instead of 'newclear' and that makes me think we might be missing something in this word, summat you might like to ponder on! Whereas I'm just happy to see the green leaves on the trees and the return of the Swallows and Swifts, and Mother Nature putting on her summer dress at last.

Greetings from North Cave Parish Council

We aim to hold our meetings on the 3rd Tuesday of every month at 7pm in the Village Hall. Coronation

Coronation mugs donated by NCPC, were presented to pupils of North Cave Church of England Primary School at an assembly on the day before the Coronation of King Charles III.

Millennium Walk

Due to a tree falling down on Millennium Walk and a subsequent survey being completed by EYRC, a number of trees have been cut back for safety reasons. Tidying up and re-seeding has already been started and a new path will be laid as soon as the trunk has been removed and heavy equipment is no longer needed.

We are aiming to have the Walk cleared and all areas re-seeded by Autumn. New shrubs, trees and wild flowers will then be planted once the grass is established. This work is anticipated to start in late Autumn 2023 or

early 2024 and will be completed by NCPC in conjunction with NCIB.

Flower Baskets

Because of the cold weather, the hanging baskets will not be delivered until 1st week in June. This year we are also having a planter positioned at the junction of Westgate and Station Road. We are hoping that this will become a permanent feature of the flower displays which decorate our village throughout summer.

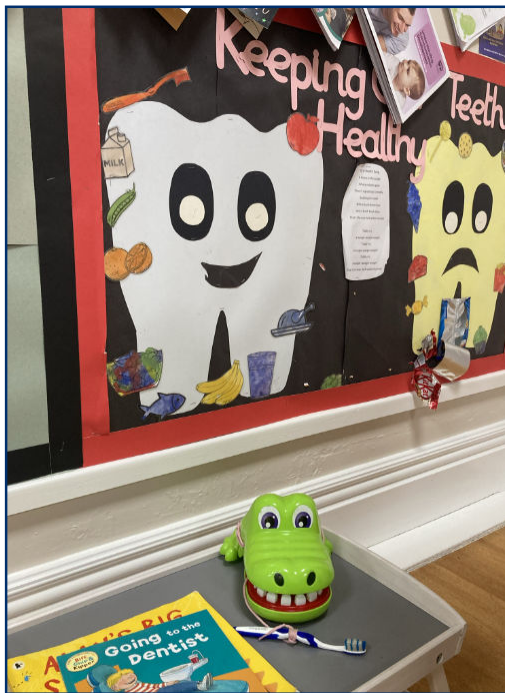

Update - Early Summer 2023

First of all, thanks to Wendy for her glorious 'Countryside Concerns' in this issue. Beautifully written, as always - we can't compete! (See P5) We would agree that there is a widely accepted need to improve our environment, but its not happening far or fast enough. The decline of nature continues. Has anyone else noticed that the dawn chorus seems to be a pale shadow of what it was just a few years ago? There was a time when it could wake you up at 4am in the morning - not any more. We now think we are lucky to see a single lapwing over the nearby fields - there used to be flocks of them when we first moved to North Cave in the 80's. We would hear a cuckoo every spring... but not for years now. Its not that these wonderful birds have completely disappeared, but their numbers have plummeted in response to intensive agriculture and chemicals - there is always a price to pay for big machines and cheaper food.

Let's hope that we can find a better balance - and soon - between vital food production and vital natural ecosystems. There has to be a way.

On Wendy's point of tidal power - sometimes there is not enough tidal range to generate enough power, and sometimes managing the tides over a big area (such as the Wash or Humber) would have enormous impacts on the wildlife that depends on those estuary habitats. Of course, as a windy island nation, we should actively develop our renewable opportunities in wind, solar, wave and tidal. A good mix of renewables is the best way forward. But one thing to watch out for: there are limited routes to get power, e.g. from offshore wind, into the national grid - and one of them is Creyke Beck at Cottingham. It would not be at all surprising to see big new power lines being planned in our area in the not-too-distant future.

As for 'newkiller' power - quite! Give me a wind turbine any day of the week!

Trees and the Humber Forest

A great way to improve our environment is to plant trees - they provide for wildlife, clean our air and water, help reduce flooding, look beautiful through the seasons, and make our towns, villages and gardens cooler in the heat of summer (hard to imagine after this cold spring - but just around the corner!).

When we plant trees, it will take 20-50 years before they really start delivering their benefits, and a 100 years before they are big enough to provide their true potential. This means two things:

1) The best time to plant a tree is 20 years ago, the second best time is now, so let's crack on! (All credit to the North Cave Parish Council for planning and planting the new trees along Newport Road.)

2) Mature trees should always be valued and protected. As we have said before, it only takes somebody with a chainsaw an hour to destroy the growth and value of a mature tree that has taken 100 years to achieve its size. And replacement planting can't come close to actually replacing the functions that are lost when a mature tree is felled or heavily cut back. Of course, "right tree, right place" is an important guide to keep in mind when planting, but some people are far too ready to see trees cut back or removed altogether, when there is no need - and a when there is a great deal to be lost.

So, if you want help planting trees, where can you go?

If tree planting could help to reduce flooding or improve water quality, you can of course talk to West Wolds Slow The Flow. There is an 'Introduction to Natural Flood Management' on our website ([link at the top of this page](#)) which explains the ways that woodlands and hedgerows can help.

One of WWSTF's partners is the wonderful team at the Humber Forest (<https://www.humberforest.org>), who can provide an enormous range of help to landowners. They pride themselves on being a 'one-stop-shop' for all large-scale and community tree planting needs. They team up with the Woodland Trust and the Forestry Commission, reviewing all inquiries and directing them to the planting schemes which are best suited to the landowner's needs.

What has struck us, over recent years of meeting with the Humber Forest team, is just how marvellous their offer now is. It used to be that if you wanted to plant an area with trees, you had to apply for woodland grants to the Forestry Commission, which were, quite frankly, hard work, didn't cover the full cost of planting, and had a lot of red-tape and long-term obligations.

The offer from the Humber Forest is essentially this: if you have an idea that you would like to plant trees, they will come and talk to you, find out the best scheme to support you, deal with any technical checks (ecology, archaeology, planning), provide suggestions as to the best species, pay for the planting AND pay for five years of maintenance - which is all that should be needed to establish a young, thriving woodland. This is an amazing service and they are lovely, friendly people - if a bit over-worked at the moment!

Only one warning from WWSTF (which we have shared with Humber Forest). Once you plant a tree, you fix the ground level around it, so can't later lower that area to store or shift storm water. Trees and water management go together brilliantly - but it needs to be thought about before they are planted! As ever - talk to us, we're friendly too!

The Joan Castle Memorial Trophy

The first quarter of 2023 has been a busy period for the North Cave ringers and the East Riding School of Bell Ringing. The school ran six full day workshops spread between our two Ringing Centres and these attracted over 100 ringers from all over the North of England. Our work with the training of new recruits at other towers has continued to grow helped greatly by the national "Ring for the King" recruitment initiative, presently we are training six recruits at Bubwith, seven at Kirk Ella and two at Middleton on the Wolds.

The work we have put into Bubwith is really paying dividends, from a church with no ringers and silent bells they are now a vibrant band of fourteen ringers who full support the church and have a very successful recruitment plan.

In April we were presented with the Joan Castle Memorial Trophy by the Beverley & District Ringing Society, this is awarded to the church that rings the most quarter peals within a year, this is the first time that we have won this and now gives us the triple crown of ringing awards within the East Riding having also won both categories in the regional striking competitions in recent years.



As you can imagine the Coronation kept us busy not only over the weekend itself but also in the weeks leading up to it. In the last week of April we were visited by ITV who spent two hours with us interviewing and filming, it was all part of their planned build up for the Coronation and it was

aired on their regional Calendar programme as well as part of it going out on their National news programmes. It was great experience and very interesting to see how they put everything together.

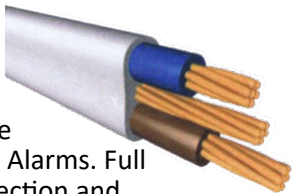

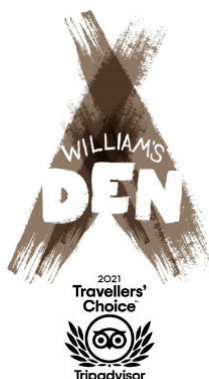
