### **Countryside Concerns**

My first job has to be to congratulate the "West Wolds Slow the Flow" for their answer to my point on tidal power for green energy and while I take their point that it wouldn't work everywhere around our island, I'd like to pose another idea of mine (I feel a debate coming on):- We have all these wind turbines out at sea so why can't someone come up with an idea to join a waveturbine to the existing mechanism of the wind turbine, thus generating twice the electricity from each structure! If a Greek mathematician born centuries ago can come up with a fantastic invention(the Archimedes Screw) in 287-212BC surely, in this day and age, we have a bright spark somewhere in the country who can come up with a simple modification to work wave and wind together and to all the navsayers who shake their heads and say 'N0 it cant be done' I say 'Why'? If the adults can't invent something I bet the youngsters of today could, they like nothing better than inventing stuff so get the idea out there into all the schools and colleges up and down the country and I'm sure they will relish the challenge, especially if there was a cash incentive! and another thing - why haven't all these turbines got solar panels on top?

Moving on, I'm so glad the mini heatwave only lasted a week or so in June, it wasn't just me that felt it but our wildlife too. Most of our birds retreated into the undergrowth around the soft fruit bushes until it cooled down. The rain came iust in time to refill 4 out of 5 water butts we have and even though the bird bath was kept full, we had a wagtail that enjoyed a daily bath in a large plant saucer on the ground. Everything was hungry too and we even had squirrels curled round the sunflower seed feeder, plus wood pigeons and doves who performed some amazing acrobats in their attempts to grab a snack. We love the fact that we still get a nightly visit from the hedgehog for the cat biscuits and water left out for it. I've noticed throughout the year how the variety of birds on the feeders changes, in winter and spring its mostly goldfinch, blue tit and greenfinches, then they disappear and are replaced with

sparrows, starlings and blackbirds, even a robin tried his luck on the feeders. Blue tits have been very scarce this year and greenfinches too in fact we had two finches we found dead under the feeders round about the time when bird flu was about, neither of them had any visible signs of damage, the plumage was perfect and they were not underweight in fact I couldn't find anything wrong at all but I wrapped them in a tissue and buried them under a rose bush. Butterflies are scarce too and apart from the odd orange tip and a few cabbage whites we don't seem to have any brown butterflies around just now. Maybe the cold spring had a lot to do with it.

Through the years I've enjoyed watching how our countryside changes, some are for the better but too many for the worse. Back in the 50's we had plenty of everything, hedgerows, bats, wayside flowers, ground nesting birds like skylark, lapwing and curlew. most of the water courses had sticklebacks, minnow and water voles and we had elm trees in abundance, I don't think many of our grandchildren will ever see the majestic shape of a mature elm. I can remember looking out from my bedroom window in Hotham at the elm tree in Copeland's pasture on the back road and seeing the outline of an Indian chief in his feathered headdress, nobody else could grasp what I saw but the profile of his chin, hooked nose and prominent eyebrow blended seamlessly into his magnificent headdress but I was the only one who could see him but then again I'm the one who can see teddy bears, sheep and flying pigs and human faces in summer cloud formations, even now when I look at the tree across the road there is an outline of a lions head with a flowing mane and as the wind moves the leaves it looks like his mouth opens in a roar:- Crikey I'll be seeing fairies next!!

#### We have recently had some changes to our Parish Council:

In the meantime, until our new Clerk takes up their post, we are sharing the load to enable us to continue to serve the community.

#### **Millennium Walk**

There are just two small trees still to be removed, topsoil to be added and the path gravelled then this special area will be left for the wildlife to enjoy, with only essential maintenance carried out when needed.

#### **Newport Road trees**

TCV, the company who planted the trees, assessed them recently and the majority are growing very well. Some of the silver birches have suffered from sunburn but are still alive. They suggested residents who live nearby, if they are able, could use their grey water to help the trees during these hot dry days.

#### **ERYC Walkabout**

Walkabouts give parish council

representatives a formal opportunity to identify routine work to be carried out by the ERYC village taskforce team. By the time you read this newsletter our walkabout should have taken place whereby items of work identified, which fall within the scope of work the teams can do, will be carried out according to priority during their regular visits and will be completed by the end of the grass cutting season. The basic tasks which can be undertaken by the village taskforce teams include-minor pothole repairs, street asset painting, sign washing, and the cutting back of overgrown vegetation.

#### North Cave Beck Maintenance

The Environment Agency will be clearing some of the overgrown vegetation encroaching into the beck by Froscoles Bridge which could impede the flow of water. They will also cut back vegetation, including self-sown saplings, growing out of the retaining wall. This work is to be carried out in early August, then a follow up later in the year. Please see letter on the following pages.

#### creating a better place for people and wildlife

Following is the text of a letter received:

#### Environment Agency Maintenance Programme

We are writing to you on behalf of the Environment Agency, to keep you informed regarding the routine maintenance which occurs annually along North Cave Beck.

We are aware that over the years, North Cave Beck and the way by which it is maintained, has changed and as a result some local residents may have some questions that the Environment Agency would like to answer. As these changes are implemented, we wanted to keep the local residents and business owners informed.

Annually, the Environment Agency carry out routine maintenance on the structures, bridges, channel side and the channel itself of North Cave Beck. Below is a brief description of what maintenance is completed.

Bridges – These are maintained twice per year. This is purely for vegetation removal and conveyance purposes. Any other maintenance on bridges lies with the asset owner.

Structures – These are maintained once per quarter. This includes checking that they are structurally sound, vegetation clearance and minor brickwork repairs.

Channel Sides – These are maintained twice per year during the in-channel maintenance. The roadside from Mires Bridge upstream along Low Mill Lane is cut right down as the tractor and flail is used to provide access for the in-channel work. To compensate for this, we leave more cover on the opposite bank.

In Channel – This is maintained twice per year. This includes the removal of in channel vegetation and debris to ensure there are no blockages to the conveyance of water. The inchannel maintenance undertaken in winter is more invasive than the in-channel maintenance undertaken in the summer. For example, more vegetation is removed ahead of winter, and more sympathetic maintenance during the Spring. Similarly,



where the channel is open and naturally wider, more vegetation cover is left in and around the channel for wildlife and biodiversity.

Over the last few years, we have trialled various maintenance techniques to ensure biodiversity and recreation benefit from the work we (the Environment Agency) undertake. Our priority, however, must be flood risk and to ensure that the homes and businesses within the proximity of North Cave Beck are protected to the best of our ability from the risk of flooding. All of the above maintenance activities have always been carried out, it is the method by which they are done that has been altered. For example, the Environment Agency trialled leaving more channel side vegetation for an increase in biodiversity without impacting flood risk. Following this, the Environment Agency have identified the best methods of maintenance which considers the aspects mentioned above. Although this was successful, this also meant that inspection of the assets was difficult and therefore potential defects could easily be missed. Therefore, going forward the Environment Agency will revert to clearing the vegetation on the channel sides. but where there is more natural cover to the channel (such as where there are trees) some of this vegetation will be left, to enhance the biodiversity.




