

Community First Responder Scheme

How would you like to give something very immediate and very meaningful back to our local communities, at no cost to you, just time and dedication?

We're delighted to announce that we have an additional **Volunteer Community First Responder**, based in South Cave, to augment our team of Basic Life Support responders, and we would love to have more people in the team - please read on, for a description of who we are, what we do, and what we would need from you.

We are the Yorkshire Ambulance Service Community First Responders, covering South and North Cave, and, separately, Brough and Elloughton, and the nearby villages and communities.

Yorkshire Ambulance Service operates the Community First Responder (CFR) scheme where volunteers are trained to use life-saving skills and equipment in their local area, when they are the nearest available resource to certain medical emergencies.

In many medical emergencies the first few minutes are critical and, if effective treatment can be provided at this time, lives can be saved. This is especially true for conditions that have caused someone to lose consciousness, or to suffer a cardiac arrest.

When a 999 call is received in our Emergency Operations Centre (EOC), an ambulance is dispatched. At the same time, a CFR, on-call in the area, can be alerted and asked to attend the incident to ensure assistance reaches the patient as quickly as possible.

We are based within the community, and may therefore only be minutes away from a medical emergency, where we can locate the patient, and in the most serious cases, commence CPR and attach a defibrillator in the event of cardiac arrest, until the Ambulance arrives.

Very often our role however is to deal with situations where the patient is still conscious and breathing, but may be seriously ill, for example, a heart attack, angina, stroke, chest pains, breathing difficulties, diabetic emergencies, asthmatic issues,

or allergic reactions. In these cases, CFRs take initial observations from the patient, provide reassurance, and administer some basic support such as oxygen therapy, before handing over the patient to the Ambulance crews.

If you could be interested in learning more, here's a summary of the main requirements.

You need to be:-

- At least 18 years old;
- Able to commit to a minimum of 20 flexible hours per month of voluntary service (to be arranged in conjunction with the local volunteer team).
- Prepared to undertake an Enhanced
 Disclosure and Barring Service check,
 occupational health screening, a 3-day
 training course, and complete statutory and
 mandatory online training.

In addition you must have a valid, full UK driving licence with no more than three penalty points, and have access to a vehicle which can be used for responding purposes - we are required to comply with normal road law and the Highway Code.

We have up to six team meetings per year, with our YAS Trainer, for skills refreshment, requalification, and launch of additional equipment and processes

Community First Responders come from all different walks of life and volunteer for many different reasons.

Anyone who wants to help their community can become a CFR.

No previous medical experience or training is necessary although you will need to have good communication skills and IT literacy, a caring attitude and be able to cope well, under pressure.

North Cave Wetlands 2023

Visitors to our Wetlands will have seen much activity over the past 18 months on Crosslands Lake to the north of Crosslands Hide and the gate at the end of our section of Dryham Lane.

Crosslands Lake was initially deep throughout after quarrying by former owners Humberside Aggregates. Their successors Breedon asked us if they could tip inert waste at its southern end, which we gladly agreed in order to give us a separate habitat of shallow water and a reedbed. The subsequent reed planting has been only partially successful so far because of predation by Greylag Geese, but we have plenty of young reeds for the future in nurseries along the south and east sides for transplanting, as already successfully achieved at the south end of lake 2A, off the far end of Dryham Lane beyond Dryham Farm.

On the west bank of Crosslands Lake a new elevated hide is being built this autumn to give another view to the east over Crosslands Lake, and to the west over a brilliant new 15 acre lake, initially known as 1A, behind Dryham Farm, for which there is little visibility from Dryham Lane. Breedon and their subcontractor S.H. Plant have made an absolutely brilliant job in building an 8 acre rectangular island therein to plans drawn up by Yorkshire Wildlife Trust's long established landscape and habitat designer, Phil Fermor. This island consists of a raised gravel covered external bank, targeted primarily at breeding Avocet and Little Ringed Plover, inside which there is a shallow ridge and furrow wetlands lagoon for all passage and breeding waders, with particularly appropriate habitat for wader chicks. We may have some escorted visitors to this new hide briefly on the afternoon of 7th October following YWT's AGM at Drewtons earlier in the day, but it is anticipated that we will need a further 6 months for completion of landscaping works, including grass planting, fencing and signage/ display signs, before formally opening to all

next spring. In the meantime we cannot speak too highly of the restoration works Breedon have done for us; we look forward to an exceptional addition to our Reserve's habitat and visitor facilities.

It has been a difficult summer for water, with the past two years receiving an inadequate supply to give us all the levels we ideally need. To the south of Dryham Lane Cell A under Crosslands Hide has been particularly dry, but we needed it thus this autumn to try and dispose of Crassula weed, an invasive species that does much damage to shallow water marshland. The lakes to both south and north of Dryham Lane are all interlinked with underground pipe controls, and with our three newly restored lakes in particular our quality of habitat will rely on higher winter levels to feed ideal summer levels.

Elsewhere on the Reserve we have enjoyed some great viewing of passage waders, particularly from Turret Hide overlooking Island Lake which we have temporarily drained for the autumn season. A particular attraction was a rare Red Necked Phalarope – our third record in over 20 years – which along with only two other Phalarope species worldwide has a unique habit of swimming in tight circles and picking bugs and flies off the water surface at a rapid pace. One or two Bitterns have been on site in the reedbeds all summer, but we still await a first for them as breeders.

Gary continues to lead the birding team with his unrivalled knowledge of our wildlife. Our Thursday morning volunteers have done yeoman work throughout the year supporting our site manager Tony and his assistant Paul – including planting 35,000 of Mires Beck grown reed plugs over the past two years - whilst Lisa and assistants remain as popular as ever at the The Little Butty Bus. The whole team continues to offer a great experience for all our visitors.

Countryside Concerns

The first week of September and already the signs of autumn are showing in the trees - a splash of gold here and a glimpse of russet there, then a blaze of red from the berries on the hawthorn make up the palette for a colourful season ahead, all thanks to our fickle British weather that never fails to throw us a curve ball of some description.



Maybe its thanks to the recent very warm weather we had (just as the school holidays ended) that lots of Red Admiral butterflies finally made their appearance.

They usually make their way back across the Channel at the end of autumn to seek out warmer climes but, for the past couple of years, quite a number have hibernated here as our climate gets ever warmer winters. The same thing has happened to some of the Swallows too with quite a few staying down south and spending the winter with us.

Mother Earth certainly keeps us on our toes by baking us to a crisp with forest fires before sending tremendous storms and hurricanes to flood the lands taking lives and properties as if to punish us for our bad management of the planet. When I look at all the dead and inhospitable worlds in our solar system, it makes me wonder if mankind was in some way responsible for them in some way or other, in a time before we evolved on the Earth. Were we placed here as part of an experiment by beings light years away to see if we could survive? Our planet is unique but why is it unique? So many questions I would like to know the answer to before this enquiring mind expires.

Another thing that is bothering me is spiders!! This year they seem to be bigger and blacker

than ever. I was out of bed at 4.10, fly-swat in hand, waiting for this mini tarantula to come within striking distance. Thank goodness I got it, otherwise I would have been a nervous wreck if it had got away. Two days later there was another one, but Henry Hoover sucked this one up despite my worry that it wouldn't go down the pipe!

Anyway, let's get on to something more appealing - Angie Brown has been following the progress of a pair of Barn Owls that took up residence in an owl box they put up and have been watching their every move via a camera they installed, she even has a special Facebook page following the laying of eggs to them leaving the nest. A calendar is available to purchase from her with any profits going to the Barn Owl Trust so, if you would like a calendar, please get in touch with her asap.

Denton Lane in Hotham was the subject of a special meeting held in the village hall on Aug.3rd due to the fact that persons unknown had applied for it to be "a lane open to all traffic" whereas at present it is classed as a Bridleway. The meeting was well attended and letters of objection were asked for to be sent to the Planning Inspectorate in Bristol. Denton Lane is and always has been classed as a green lane open to all walkers and horse riders etc, with the occasional farm vehicle needing to access the fields. If the classification changes it would mean that any Hooray Henry could take his 4x4 and tear up and down the lane to his heart's content and not give a toss about the flora and fauna unique to the lane. Not only that, but it would in time become an elite building site as there is every possibility of this happening as the surrounding fields are sold off. I sincerely hope that the entire village sent in letters of objection as the outcome of the meeting will be known on the 17th October at 10.00am at Newbald Village Hall. To lose the present status would be a travesty to all the villagers past and present. Lets hope we win!

We're open to the public 7 days a week through the season. This year, we're also growing 375,000 trees for conservation sites. Belgrave Barn Owl Antics



It all started in December 2019 when we put The Box up, high in the roof of the shed. Having seen Barn Owls flying in and out of the shed for months we thought: let's see what happens! Within a couple of weeks, two beautiful owls were sitting on a beam watching us...watching them!!

Lots of noise was heard in early June 2020 so we decided to get the box checked by Karen, our local volunteer ringer, and discovered two healthy owlets. With only a cheap camera, I watched them most nights flying round the paddock and over North Cave Wetlands as they hunted for food. They continued to spend Winter nights in the box so we were hopeful for another brood!

As June 2021 approached, the adults seemed

busy feeding and this time I had constructed a trail camera on top of a wooden pole leaning on some bales, moving it every morning to check the photos. We then had our first very grainy images as the camera was at some distance from the nest. Again on checking the box, we discovered two more healthy owls, who fledged and left the box for their adventures!

In March 2022, we decide to put a camera on the roof of

the shed to catch any movement. It involved wires, car batteries, plastic boxes and a lot of swearing! June 2022 saw a fantastic box full of five owlets providing a great picture of them all sitting together on their little house. They all dispersed in early August.

Curious to see what went on behind the scenes ...I bought a mini box camera, and with brilliant help from another Owl Watcher, it was installed inside The Box, along with extra cables, plugs and WiFi in the shed. Belgrave Barn Owl Antics Owl Story had started.

We watched The Love Life of Owls, The Battle for The Box with the Tawnies, The Egg Laying, The Incubating, The Hatching, The Feeding, The Survival of the Strongest, The Sibling Rivalry and finally the Fledging of another three owlets. We did have five eggs originally...but nature took over and only three survived. Patience was needed and time wasted...but to watch these ugly little little balls of fluff grow into beautiful silent killing machines has been a wonderful experience and a privilege which I hope can be repeated.

Hello!!

My name is John Brattan, and I am one of a group of volunteer individuals who look after the upkeep of the Playing Fields, the Play Area, the Club and the Changing Facilities up at North Cave.

To understand why we exist as a group, I need to explain the history and the structure of it all.

North Cave Playing Field Association [PFA] and attached facilities is not council run or funded. In fact, we receive absolutely no support from any Council either local or central. The PFA is a Charitable Trust; which came in to being some 70 years ago, after a local family gifted the land to "The Village", for the promotion of social and recreational events.

As mentioned, the Play Area is part of the set up and again is funded by the PFA plus, you might have seen, local businesses who advertise through installed banners. Many thanks to them!!! People travel from all around to visit the Play Area, such is the quality and feel of the place.

The PFA and all those involved, fund, manage and maintain the whole thing, hence the group of unpaid individuals.



There are two groups of people I need to talk about today:

1. The COGS or "Cave Old G"!*TS"

This comprises of a motley crew of retired gentlemen from North Cave and Everthorpe, who work outside of the main management committee, from all walks of life, spread over a 15-year age span. We go down there on Tuesday mornings to empty the bins, burn rubbish and manage any maintenance issues at the Club and the Play Area. There is always a list. We have coffee at 10.30, when the banter is thick, fast, and sharp. The chat invariably includes the good old days, individual's health [we have a retired doctor in the group] the weather and which bin day it is. We are a curious team. So, if you are of that ilk, put your scruffy stuff on and come and join us; it is a laugh.



2. The Ground Management Team [GMT] - not the union!!

The GMT is a group of three individuals, again outside of the main management committee, which includes Steve Thackeray, Craig Hewson, and myself. Our aim is to improve the quality of the fields for live amateur sport. Craig and I have both been on Ground Management courses, which is a necessary requirement for grant funding through the Football Foundation, who have become major financial partners. Steve is the retired golf course manager of Hull Golf Club in Kirkella and what Steve does not know about grass, isn't worth knowing.

North Cave Sports and Social Club

Craig and I have hammered the grant side of things, with notable successes. The first project was to replace our ageing maintenance equipment securing a £30,000 grant. Job done.

More recently, we have been successful with a 6-year rolling grant of £36,000 in total, for the Maintenance and Improvement of the playing surfaces and £2500 for a Spreader and Drag mat that will allow us to bring in-house once outsourced needs, giving us total control and flexibility.

I cannot express enough how critically important the Football Foundation has been in our ongoing aims. They have been superb.

Craig and I resigned from the "Playing Fields Committee" last year, with the expressed wish to drive things forward on the funding and presentation side of the Playing Fields [the physical bit]. There has been an influx of new individuals at the Club and on the Playing Fields Committee, giving energy and driving much needed changes.

The Club has been refurbished and is now open as a fully licensed venue for village or personal events. The pavilion roof has recently been cleaned of moss (well done Simon!) A new Kitchen has been installed.

We are planning a new patio in front of the Clubhouse, which is well on its way. The first steps

being to secure **Planning** Permission and funding. We are in the process of securing Section 106 grant moneys from building work that has taken place around us over recent years, which is earmarked for an upgrade of the Play Area.

We are hosting



Charity Football Teams such as SANDS [an early infant mortality charity] along with Hull City ex-Tigers and we are now the home ground for Hull City Ladies Reserves.

The whole group is focused on improvement and bringing to the front a Club and Playing Fields that fulfils the original aim of promoting the "Social and Recreational" needs of the village in the 21st Century.

Website: Unfortunately, our website has been out of action for some time so we are in the process of ordering a brand-new, fresh-looking website which will be built to meet the necessary standards required (accessibility, security, image) and will reap dividends for the village and its residents. If there are any community groups who would like a page/ blog on our new website please email your interest to our clerk by the end of October. In the meantime, agendas, minutes and essential legal documents are still displayed in the PC noticeboard situated on Westgate at the top of Finkle Street.

Millennium Walk: NCPC were very grateful to Steve Meays from Mires Beck for visiting the Millennium Walk to advise us on wildflower & tree planting. He recommended Hazel & Buckthorn trees which we will plant in October. In spring we will add primrose, cowslips, as well as suitable wild flowers and North Cave in Bloom will add crocus bulbs this Autumn. Breedons very kindly supplied us with grit for the paths, so the A-Team of volunteers were kept busy barrowing, spreading and raking to provide a good surface for walking on. Thanks to Debs for the delicious buns to keep us going! This is a very special area used regularly



by many, so we hope it will be treated with the respect it deserves and that dog owners will bag it and bin it. in the bin provided by the Parish Council.

Traffic problems: We are very much aware of the increase in traffic through our village, especially the volume of caravans and HGVs over 7.5 tonnes. We believe signage is needed on the M62 prior to the slip road to North Cave. It is National Highways England who are responsible for the signs on the motorways so we will send requests to them. It would be helpful if any record of incidents you have could be sent to the police, we continue to report to ERYC and many residents are contacting Google maps to try to get them to amend directing traffic through here, the more that do this the better the chances of them acting. NCPC have put in a request to ERYC to upgrade the current pedestrian crossing to a Pelican Crossing, we are waiting for a reply.

Environmental Agency works in the Beck:

The summer maintenance has been carried out in and alongside the beck side to remove vegetation and blockages. The second stage will be carried out ahead of winter, with more vegetation being removed. Where the channel is naturally wider and more open, more vegetation cover may be left for wildlife and biodiversity.

North Cave Playing Fields: It takes a huge amount of funds to cover the costs of the extensive maintenance of the playground so NCPC have agreed to donate £1000 towards this.

Everthorpe Orchard Proposal: The Everthorpe Village Forum has asked ERYC if they would gift the orchard opposite Milestone Farm to the community as common land. They would like to plant new fruit trees alongside the ancient existing ones and maintain it as an amenity for the village and the wider parish of North Cave with free fruit for all and a safe enclosed space for children and village events.

Mill Lane and Low Mill Lane Footbridges: The need to urgently repair and make safe, both these footbridges have been reported to ERYC by NCPC and many residents during the last few months so we hope action will be taken by them asap.

The Barlow family seat: a member of the Barlow family contacted NCPC for guidance in replacing their existing seat on the Village Green with a new sturdy one. They have agreed to gift the new seat to us so we can add to our asset register.

Hedgehog decline, you can help!

In the 1950s there were an estimated 30 million hedgehogs in the UK sadly now there are less than one million! This is due to:

- · Loss of hedgerows and field margins.
- Loss of habitat in urban areas due to housing developments, car parking etc.
- New roads, fences and walls carve up suitable habitat and sometimes isolate populations which in turn prevents breeding.
- Lack of wild areas means a lack of bugs and beetles resulting in a lack of suitable food sources for the hedgehogs. This is often a result of "over-tidy" gardens.
- With more cars on the roads than ever before, roadkill is a big problem.
- Use of pesticides and slug pellets can poison hedgehogs and also kill the bugs that they eat.

There has never been a better time to get involved in hedgehog conservation and with this in mind

5-inch gap in your fence
and add the fence
surround. This gap in a
fence is essential in the
battle to prevent the
extinction of our
endangered spiky

Update - Autumn 2023

We are working on designs for the four sites that we mentioned in the April issue:

- Drewton Beck at Drewton Farm (west of the A1034) and Mill Farm Everthorpe;
- Land at Millfield and at Woodale, Ellerker,
- The Mires and Pratt Wood at Newbald.

We are still trying to work out technical issues like design and maintenance liability, planning approvals and ecological surveys, but with a fair wind, we aim to start on site this financial year.

We also met with **Everthorpe Forum** in August, who explained the many issues they face with surface water in Everthorpe. We will be drawing up 'issues' and 'options' plans to take back to them ASAP.

Meanwhile, East Riding Council is working on measures along Little Moor Drain to reduce flooding at Finkle Street and along the drain (which passes under Station Road and North Cave Primary School.

As we prepare for these projects to happen, we also want to re-start talks on other sites, for development next year and onward. There are many places around the West Wolds affected by surface water flooding. We are just getting started!

Our Data Capture project is going very well. As well as flow rate/level cameras already installed, by University of Hull, downstream of Newbald and North Cave, and the weather station at North Cave Primary, we will this year be installing:

- · A weather station at each of South Cave Primary and Newbald Primary Schools
- A flow/level camera upstream of North Cave
- A flow/level camera upstream of Ellerker
- Other sensors upstream of Newbald

Ideally we would like more sensors around the catchment (funds allowing) so if you live near a beck or drain and would like to find out about hosting a flow/level camera (we only need a bit of power and a wired connection to your router) then please get in touch. This is a great way to support our project and to do your bit to help monitor water levels in response to storms and, in time, perhaps provide early warnings of potential flooding.

Our dream is to have a dashboard on the West Wolds website (or linked to from the West Wolds site) from which we can compare all storm events and beck/drain levels, so that we can better understand how our water responds to severe weather in an increasingly uncertain climate.

The government has just announced a £25 million fund for Natural Flood Management (NFM), which we may bid to be part of - we will take advice from

our friends at the Environment Agency. The main significance of this for us is that the importance of NFM is being recognised at the highest levels - it's not just those 'so-called experts' on Everthorpe Lane who think this is a good idea. (Incidentally, we don't claim expertise ourselves - but we have connected with a lot of people who are experts!)

Unfortunately, the NFM funding doesn't make any specific allowance for maintenance, which they expect to be paid for through the agricultural funding system 'ELMS', which, as any of our farming friends will tell us, is a dog's breakfast of uncertainty. We hope to work with a number of partners to see if we can bring any clarity to the picture for landowners and farmers in the West Wolds... we will be in touch if we can find any answers!

Meanwhile, the rain garden planters, that were installed in March, at North and South Cave Primary Schools, have looked amazing through the spring and summer and have been greatly enjoyed by the children and the bees, as well as slowing some of the flow off the school roofs!
