The downside is that our printing costs will have to rise, so we are going to be obliged to ask advertisers for an increased fee. This will be in the region of 40-50% on previous rates. But all future advertising renewals will be at the increased rates.

When we think back, we have not increased

our advertising rates since we began in 2000! And we know that they are already very low compared to other village publications, because the only costs we need to cover are our printing costs. Everything else, from editorial to distribution, and posting through every door in the parish, is done for free by our wonderful team of volunteers.

So, we hope that advertisers will recognise this as a belated and modest increase, in return for which they continue to support their local community and secure a place in the all new, colour, Village Link!

Bringing Cricket Back to North Cave

After a four-year wait, cricket will be returning to North Cave Playing Fields in 2024. Andy Swallow,

Chair of the new North Cave Coal Exporters Cricket Club (NCCECC), explains more...

Hello, I'm Andy, and I'm excited to let you know that after discussions between the old Hull Ionians Coal Exporters Cricket Club (HICECC), former members of North Cave Cricket Club (NCCC) and the North Cave Playing Fields Association, we have reached an agreement to move HICE from its former Brantingham Park home to North Cave.

To reflect this exciting new future, we have created a new name and club badge that reflects both clubs' proud histories.

Looking back...

TPORT

The North Cave Cricket Club was formed in the late 19th century - with the original ground and pavilion at Fairfield, off Station Road, North Cave. The club has also played at Newport Road in the village and also at Hotham Hall.

NCCC moved to the present ground in 1973 when the new playing fields were constructed. In the 1980's the new clubhouse was constructed for the cricket and football clubs, and a sports and social club was formed. Affectionately known as 'The Coalies', Hull



Ionians Coal Exporters have a proud history dating back to 1909, when the original Coal Exporters Cricket Club was formed, made up of members of the coal exporting and allied trades.

The Coal Exporters have played at a number of grounds through their history, including the Stray at the Circle (now location of the MKM stadium). Costello Plaving Fields, the Ferens Recreation Ground before moving to Springhead Lane.

Following a merger with Hull Ionians Cricket Club in 1996, the club became known as Hull Ionians Coal Exporters.

HICE have enjoyed a successful time at Brantingham Park but, after hugely positive discussions with the North Cave Playing Fields Association(NCPFA) this September, HICE members voted unanimously to move the club to Church Street.

Following the decision our volunteers have been working alongside Craig Hewson, John Backhouse and the Trust grounds team to get the cricket square ready for winter. Members have worked tirelessly to move mowers, rollers sightscreens, covers and lots more to North Cave too.

A bright new future

The new dawn will see two NCCE teams compete in the Yorkshire Premier League North Division One and Division Four Holderness Saturday cricket leagues from the 2024 season, and we'll have a midweek team too.

We are passionate about developing the next generation of cricketers and will be running All Stars (ages 5-8) and Dynamos (ages 8-11)

junior programmes during the summer, along with an under 11s team.

We're working with the NCPFA Trust and seeking funding to improve the Plaving Field practice facilities specifically an AstroTurf cricket net. which the whole community will be able to use.

PLAY AREA:



time later, when we were given the 'go ahead', I did think we had no chance at all before Christmas. Unbelievably we were able to secure the East Riding of Yorkshire Band for 11th November, which was such an unexpected honour.

Many many thanks go to the Band for their professionalism, organisation and enthusiasm. They were so thrilled to be performing in our church on such a meaningful date, and also for the fabulous acoustics. The programme in the first half was very varied with hymns, well

known film themes and lovely classical pieces and very moving solo performances, but the second half was just so poignant and respectful, it did move the audience to tears. We were delighted with pieces such as Passchendaele, Nimrod, Benedictus, from Elgar to Karl Jenkins, capped off by a beautiful rendition of the Evening Hymn intertwined with The Last Post - played beautifully and with respectful storytelling by musical director, Fiona Bishop.

What a superb evening we all enjoyed, a reminder of our debt to the men and women of the Armed Forces, and an opportunity for the community to come together in our beautiful church.

North Cave Bell Ringers

Back in September we competed in two ringing competitions, the first was for the East Riding area which was held at Nafferton. It must be said that we took a little bit of time getting use to these light bells, this was confirmed by the judges who said that the second half of our test piece was faultless, we ended up in third place.

Our second competition was the Yorkshire Sunday Service Band contest in Sheffield, on this occasion we were unable to field our strongest band and having to compete against the likes of York, Leeds and Rotherham Minster we were a little out of our depth and the final results confirmed this, but it was a good experience and great chance to catch up and chat with other ringers.

Early October was our six-day tour down south, which benefited from the glorious weather that bathed the whole of the UK. We broke up the journey on the way down to ring at Pershore Abbey, a tower that is on many ringers bucket list, as you ring from what is basically a cage suspended some 100 foot above the floor of the Abbey, then once up there and your knees have finally stopped trembling you have to ring a very challenging peal of eight bells with the largest one being about 1 ½ tons, great fun.

We then spent just under four days ringing on

the island of Lundy, one church, one pub, no vehicles and just twenty inhabitants, what a marvellous experience it was too. We could basically ring every day from 10am to 6pm and some fine ringing performances were achieved including a few firsts for a couple of our ringers. In between the ringing we made the most of the weather and explored this stunning island.

As I mentioned in a previous Village Link we are planning to add two additional bells to the existing six at All Saints, things have moved on since then, we have had a survey carried out on the existing bell installation by the Diocese of York bell

advisor and his report has come back with no issues and following a meeting with the church architect we have now had the first of three bell hangers visit us so that we can start putting some prices together for this project. These early stages can take bit of time to pull things together as bell hangers and bell founders are historically slow and very busy. While the costing process continues our next step is to meet with a structural engineer.

As part of our Ringing School we have continued to support and train ringers at Bubwith along training a new band of ringers at Kirkella, this now means that regular practice nights at Kirkella have started again following a two or three absence along with the strengthening of their Sunday service band.

We have just started to train Katy at North Cave, a very keen 18 year old, the early stages of rope handling can take a while but Katy is taking it all in her stride and I am confident that she will become a very strong member to our band.

As ever we continue with our main purpose, that of supporting the church with Sunday Service ringing, weddings, Harvest, Remembrance Day, funerals etc.

NCIB are pleased to welcome Dave Warren to our team. Dave has a wealth of gardening knowledge and has already helped in many ways, including planting hundreds of daffodils.

We are constantly being made aware of the need for more trees to be planted to help alleviate flood risks, so by the time you read this we hope to have planted two Hawthorn trees in the grass area off Manor Road. A representative from ERYC inspected the remains of the tree that came down there recently and confirmed it will be ground down sometime in the future, then we can revisit it and if suitable add another tree to

take its place. He also checked out Froscoles Green and confirmed that it would also be an ideal area for two trees and explained where best to plant them, avoiding the drainage pipes, so we intend to ask NCPC if they will plant trees there as they are responsible for the maintenance.

North Cave Parish Council has agreed to pay NCIB for a wooden planter to replace the rented black plastic one on the corner of Station Road/ Westgate next year, this will save them money and match the other planters throughout the village.

Countryside Concerns

I think we will all be pleased to see the back of this year, regarding the weather anyway. We seem to get more wet days with every passing month and less dry, settled ones and when the sun does shine it really lifts your

Our farmers are having a torrid time and many of them are finding it harder and harder to do the job they love. The short break in the weather to gather the corn and potatoes, their next crop of seed is now rotting in sodden fields. Unfortunately, there is nothing we can do about our weather but, behind the scenes, the boffins are doing experiments with different varieties of ancient grains to find a strain that can cope with our changing weather (they will probably cross it with rice!) Trials are also on-going with 60 varieties of potatoes to find a "super spud" that can resist disease, drought and frost, bearing in mind that the humble spud has been around for 10,000 years ever since the Peruvians discovered they could boil, bake or mash it! Out on the islands of the Outer Hebrides. farmers and crofters are working together to grow an old variety of flax in an attempt to bring back the manufacture of linen - an industry that we were very good at back in the day of textile production. Most of the linen is made in France and the Netherlands. so it would be nice if we could revive the process here, we still have a lot of the old mills in West Yorkshire, some of which already spin wool from Alpaca and sheep, also there is a firm somewhere in the country that is manufacturing jeans again, something that we usually get from Asia, so it's nice to know that we still have people willing to revive some of our past industry. Even though the jeans are being made for the 'high end' market and will be priced way out of my price range, I say well done lads.

Despite our poor old planet being under such stress, it still manages to throw up new discoveries to amaze us. In darkest Borneo they re-discovered an animal that they thought was extinct called an Echidna - spiky little animal a bit like a long-nosed hedgehog, which when it was discovered in David Attenborough's younger days was named

after him (no resemblance of course) and there it was toddling about in a mountainous region no-one had been to for decades.

Borneo seems to have many hidden interesting things to find as they had found a new species of Palm, not one with coconuts but one that fruits and flowers underground, how amazing is that! Pinanga subterrarnea has been known to the local population for eons and who have been happily snacking on its sweet, juicy fruits as part of their regular diet - that is if they can get to it before the wild boar! The Earthshot Prize has just been televised, showing just how many individuals from all over the world are committed to finding solutions to the effects of climate change on land, sea and air, a very inspiring programme and just proves to us all that if we keep doing our best to support our planet, we will pull it back from the brink. Having had a poor result on the allotment this year, I'm looking forward to a more rewarding result next year and maybe I will be concentrating on more flowers rather than veg. I will try more crops in containers and concentrate on the tried and tested Heritage varieties rather than the FI hybrids, the open pollinated ones are cheaper but hardier than their F1 cousins (I call them southern softies) and are much more expensive.

Whatever you do with the remainder of the year stay well and take your Vitamin D.

Just remember that every day that passes is a day nearer SPRING!

This year alone we have grown over 350,000 trees – a wonderful example of the amazing work carried out by adults with learning disabilities, Autism, physical, and other health issues, who attend Mires Beck Nursery.

Traffic problems

We are constantly trying to alleviate the many traffic problems in North Cave. These include contact with Highways England and ERYC to improve signage from the M62 on the slip road & ramp and better signage to deter caravans.

enforcing the weight limit on the roads and upgrading the zebra crossing to a pelican crossing. We do not know if these concerns will be actioned by ERYC but we will continue to campaign for a safer village for all. Contacting Google Maps: to change traffic navigation route is another option but to do this we require village support with numbers. It's easy to be overwhelmed by all the bad news about the environment: climate change, sea level rise, flooding, droughts, the biodiversity crisis...



The list seems endless and depressing, and far too big for any of us to do anything about.

But rather than say "it's all too much, there's nothing I can do", wouldn't it be better to say, "what can I do, in my own little patch, to make a difference?".

Through our partners at West Wolds Slow the Flow, we have the chance to offer a little something you can do to make a difference in your local area...

We talked about our fantastic **Chalk Streams** in the October-November 2022 Village Link:

https://www.villagelink.info/documents/ 2022/VLink-2022 10-11 Oct-Nov-web.pdf

"Because they are fed by water from the chalk aquifer, they are very much more constant than 'ordinary' streams. They start off clear and clean, because they are filtered by the chalk. Their rate of flow, mineral content and temperature of the water is much steadier throughout the year than that of other watercourses. These properties make them rich in insect, fish and plant life, provided they are not polluted and they do not suffer too much from water abstraction or land drainage.

No wonder then, that they are regarded as the UK's "unique contribution to global ecology". Our East Yorkshire chalk streams are some of the best in the UK. The becks that run so constantly through our villages are vitally important habitats."

We mentioned that University of Hull Biology department is undertaking research, sampling invertebrates (things like shrimps, worms, flies, snails, mussels) to establish the water quality across the catchment, from Newbald to Ellerker.

We have the chance to support this work with **Citizen Science** carried out by local people. Our friends at East Yorkshire Rivers Trust have found a project run by Natural England and the

the Freshwater Biological Association.

Discovering Priority Habitats aims to assess the natural health of smaller water-bodies. Citizen scientists are trained to conduct 'naturalness assessments' and upload their data. This will be used by Natural England to update the priority habitat designated sites in England. Refining priority habitat locations is vital in ensuring we protect natural freshwater sites in current 'good' health and encourage restoration action in desirable locations.

The Freshwater Biological Association delivers training days to external organisations interested in monitoring freshwater naturalness. Citizen scientists are given a one-day training session on how conduct entry-level naturalness assessments independently. Attendance is welcome by freshwater beginners and experts alike.

So we will be setting up a training day in the early spring, which will be free to attend. If you have an interest in nature, or perhaps you like fishing and are interested in freshwater biology, come along to learn more.


