

Apparently they can absorb oxygen from the water and the damp conditions allow them to come to the surface

and perhaps migrate. Whilst mole hills are viewed by some as an eyesore and nuisance, they actually tell us that the soil is healthy because the moles have a good supply of earthworms and earthworms are good for the soil because they aerate the ground and pull down rotting leaves etc into the ground and improve the nutrient levels, giving healthy grass. So let's celebrate earthworms!



Traffic in the Village

Beck Footbridge (off Low Mill Lane)

This bridge cannot be repaired so it is to be replaced! It is on ERYC job-list this year, it is currently out of use, therefore, please use an alternative route until it is fully functional.

If you have been on the Playing Fields recently you will have seen that work has started on the new patio. The benches on the wall of the building have been removed, the step has



been broken out and the digger has been in to dig the foundations and start to spread the stone sub-base. Volunteers, supervised by Colin Clark, will continue with the next stages with the intention that the patio will be ready in time for for North Cave Coal Exporters Cricket Club inaugural Cricket's Coming Home Gala Day.

The Playing Fields Association is very grateful to continue to receive generous donations from members of the community, the most recent including North Cave Bingo Team, Mr and Mrs Booth, Peter Atkin and the estate of Mrs Kathleen Boast, who died in October 2022. Kathleen was born in North Cave but left the village in 1955. She had various jobs including Hull Dock Labour Board, David Brown's Huddersfield and a few years at British Aerospace, Brough. She returned to the village in 1977 and lived on Newport Road. Kathleen wanted to leave something that would benefit the whole community in thanks for her happy life in the village. Her legacy will help us create a wonderful addition to the Sports Club facilities that will be there for everyone to enjoy when using the field. As we have said before, at the end of the project we plan to erect a plaque to commemorate all the

people who have helped to make the patio area a reality including those who have so generously given their time and skills.

Having said that, we still need more help to make sure that this new facility is as good as we can make it. As little as £10 will cover the cost of a paving slab, or if you have more to spare then £25 for a sleeper, £65 for a fence post or £75 a fence panel. Once we have the surface we will also need more benches and tables, so however much or little you feel you can give - your contribution will be gratefully received and put to good use.

Cricket has not been played at North Cave's Church Street ground since 2019, when the former North Cave CC sadly folded, and absence has certainly made the North Cave community fonder.

NCCECC have enjoyed a fantastic welcome and support from everyone in North Cave, with lots of work behind the scenes to get the club and its facilities ready for the new season, which will see NCCECC first team play in Division One of the Yorkshire Premier League North for the first time.



NCCECC Chair, Andy Swallow, said: "Our club has been on a fantastic journey over the past couple of years, and I'm hugely proud of what we have achieved. The North Cave Playing

Fields Trust and wider community could not have been more supportive and we can't wait for the season to begin.

"To show our appreciation, we would like to invite people from across the region to join us for Cricket's Coming Home, a grand opening event with guest of honour. Jack Russell - one of the finest wicketkeepers of his generation."

The day begins at 10.30am, with our first and second teams taking part in an inter-club T20 match. The match will be captured on canvas by Jack, and a print of the final painting will be displayed in the North Cave Social Club later

in the year. Our quest of honour will formally open NCCECC in a ceremony at 1.30pm.



There will be lots more going

on throughout the afternoon, including a barbecue, tombola, afternoon teas, cricket skills sessions and a juniors match, before we

retire to the North Cave Social Club for a Q&A with Jack. hosted by cricket iournalist



and TV pundit Rory Dollard. Following the Q&A there'll be a fundraising auction, with a chance to bid on some fantastic cricket memorabilia, including paintings by Jack Russell and a bat signed by England batter Harry Brook.

All money raised on the day will support the work of the North Cave Playing Fields Trust and North Cave Coal Exporters CC, who have ambitious plans to improve the facilities at Church Street and support the development of cricket at all levels in North Cave.

The Ups and Downs of Professional Sport

North Cave's Ted Jackson, National Senior Boxing Champion & England International, Turns Professional



Ted has recently turned professional boxer in the Middleweight category. As many will already know, he was due to make his professional debut in the Bolton Arena on December 1st 2023. Unfortunately, Ted sustained a fractured jaw in sparring two weeks prior to his debut, which served as a massive blow. Multiple blended meals later (inclusive of Christmas dinner!) together with enduring three months of recuperation, Ted has now returned to full time training in Newcastle.

Ted made the decision to train out of the famous Birtley

Boxing Gym where he is part of an

excellent professional 'stable'. He trains with his top-class team mates daily, with weekly sparring mostly coming from the GB Team. Ted turning to the professional ranks alongside such talent will only serve to push him on an upward trajectory.

Ted's amateur credentials are:

- X2 National titles
- X1 Senior National title
- X1 GB Tri Nations gold
- X1 GB Tri Nations silver
- X8 Yorkshire Champion
- Representing England x7 occasions

All this has paved the way for him to break through into the higher ranks of the professional world.

Ted already has fantastic support, which is evident to see from his ticket sales prior to his cancelled fight at Bolton Arena. Bus loads of people were prepared to make the journey across the other side of the country. Ted is grateful for such support and can't wait for his next confirmed fight. Equally Ted is really grateful for his established sponsorship and support - without which he wouldn't be able to commit to his full-time training in Newcastle. To allow him to keep up his full-time training, Ted needs further sponsorship to allow him to establish himself in his 'fledgling' career.

The rewards of success in boxing are massive, but reaching that success is the hard bit. In Ted's words....



'I believe I have all the attributes to fight at the highest level and aim to become the first British, European, and World Champion from this area. High aspirations, but I have genuinely got that belief. I would invite all my friends, neighbours, residents of the village to follow and enjoy with me my journey in the boxing world.'

Drewton Beck, looking west, towards North Cave

Our first project to be put on the ground is at Drewton Beck. Our enormous thanks go to Hotham Estates and ERYC Estates for allowing us to work in this lovely part of the valley, which lies south-east of William's Den.

Thanks also to Mark Walker for taking the excellent drone shots over the valley before we started, and to East Yorkshire Rivers Trust (EYRT) for carrying out the work and supervising a team of students from Bishop Burton College

After nearly four years of discussions, planning, and negotiation (Spring 2020-2024), in March we took our first steps to create Natural Flood Management measures on site. East Yorkshire Rivers Trust (EYRT) were on-site at Drewton Beck, clearing some overgrown willows and scrub along the beck, to "sky-light" sections, to allow more light into the valley floor, to improve the biodiversity of the beck and its floodplain. Some of the cuttings were used, depending on their size, to form either brash piles for habitat, or to create leaky barriers along the beck, to help along what is already a very nicely natural area, giving it more "roughness" and resistance to the passage of water, by pushing storm water flows onto the floodplain.

EYRT then moved on to do some more clearance work at Prattwood in North Newbald.

Both of these were operations that needed to take place before the nesting season got properly underway. We are immensely grateful to the landowners and farmers for their cooperation and for being willing to share our vision – even if it isn't always clear just what that looks like! Next steps are to progress the plans for some more substantive works on four sites (Prattwood, another part of Drewton Beck, and Woodale and Millfield, Ellerker), working towards obtaining the necessary landowner and planning approvals, and other clearances, for earthworks and re-meandering of watercourses on those sites, to take place this coming summer. sne has family ties to the island and visits regularly. It looks like a beautiful place to visit and we were all captivated by her talk.









Countryside Concerns

It's so nice to see the countryside greening up at last and the blackthorn blossom has been amazing. It's just a pity that the weather itself isn't warm enough for the bees to take advantage of it, as most days are too cold for them to fly. Quite a few of our early spring flowers have come into bloom at least four to five weeks earlier than usual and, travelling round the countryside, I have been amazed at the number of snowdrops that have appeared this year and given so much pleasure to us all.

The birds are getting into their stride with the dawn chorus and the song thrush in the trees behind is usually the first one to start singing. It has to be one of my most favourite birds as they are decreasing in numbers, mainly due to the fact that most of the grass fields around us have been turned over to arable. Our resident flock of blackbirds are a continuing source of entertainment as they chase each other off the early morning offering of mealworms. Last year we hardly saw any of the Greenfinches that come to the sunflower feeders but I was pleased to see 7 of them this year - always squabbling with the Goldfinches for the best perch.

The fields around us are still very wet and some of them have had mini lakes in them for weeks. The farmers are struggling to find land dry enough to get a tractor on and have spent most time trimming hedges and digging the ditches out. The last 6 months of wet weather has also had a worrying effect on the worm population which is falling year on year. A study, done by Dr. J. Stroud, found few or no key types of earthworms in 40% of fields studied and put the results down to land disturbance, loss of food supply and too many predators. You only have to see a farmer ploughing to witness the vast number of birds following on behind, they must consume thousands. I would be very interested to know what happens to the worms in all the flooded fields, are they fast enough to escape to drier ground, do they go deeper or do the just drown?

With the improvement in the weather, the urge to get the compost and seed trays out becomes a temptation hard to resist; then comes the question of which compost to use -

peat free or soil based?

A friend of mine handed me an article from a local publication about coir (the hairy outside of coconuts) and I found it a disturbing read. How many of us knew it takes 1,000 coconuts to make 10kg of coir; imported mainly from India, Thailand and Sri Lanka; the workforce, in some cases, provided by trained monkeys who are chained and kept in squalid conditions. Extracted coir is kept in tanks on the sides of riverbanks for 6 months (were it releases toxins like pectin, fats, tannins and bacteria (including salmonella), which pollute the river and end up in the sea) before being shipped half way round the world to Europe, to be mixed into peat-free compost for the horticultural trade.

Green waste also gets mixed into this which in itself can be full of weedkillers, microbes, sawdust, fungi and moulds. Manure also has animal antibiotics and various other medication digested by the animals.

OK, they will tell you it is all sterilised, but then they would! It's still a dilemma we need to think about, before we put our rubber gloves on! It's soil based, from my point of view, that we should plump for, so keep collecting the mole soil as well as making your own compost. I just hope my compost bin can keep up as I only empty it once a year and bag it up to keep for another 4 months before using it. Mine has lots of red worms, happy healthy red worms that have done a marvellous job of converting my veggie peelings, green waste, torn up cardboard rolls, prunings, etc. Lovely Jubbly! Happy Gardening.
