A brief message from WWSTF this time

Firstly, we note that Emma Hardy MP, who visited our Drewton Beck project in March, is now Minister for Water in the new government. We wish her well in this daunting task, and hope she will think about how to work with nature to help resolve the issues of our decaying water infrastructure.

We have been liaising with the lovely people at Everthorpe Forum and have drawn up 'Issues and Opportunities maps' with them. These have been shared with the ERYC Flood Risk team, as they consider Natural Flood Management on the East Riding estate lands around Everthorpe.

We are developing our site designs at Newbald, Drewton and Ellerker and are looking for more sites to consider - do get in touch if you have any suggestions.

Thanks to the Parish Council and NCIB for the smashing display of summer flowers grouped around the centre point of our village for all to see and enjoy.

We have finally been able to have the 20mph radar sign put back into action. It's flashing



regularly! The traffic comes down the hill towards our Primary School too quickly! Most vehicles are in excess of the limit but it puts the drivers on notice and most do reduce speed. Perhaps a large

dummy camera on top might also help??

A number of 'Keep our Village Tidy' signs have been put up at the main entrances to the village. Hopefully, it might deter some and reduce the number of bottles, coffee cups, take away trays etc that the village volunteers have to collect and bag regularly.



Beck Footbridge (off Low Mill Lane): We have been informed by ERYC Countryside Access Team that this will be repaired in 2024, so we will announce when the job is complete.

Dog Fouling in North Cave



We know that dog fouling is of concern to residents and we do need everyone's assistance to encourage dog owners to be responsible throughout the parish of North Cave & Everthorpe.

As residents of North Cave, councillors will now be keeping an eye out for fouling problems and talking to dog walkers in

our parish. We will particularly be looking at the Playing Fields and the public right of ways.

The great majority of dog walkers do pick up after their dog and get really annoyed with the few who don't as they don't want to be "tarred with the same brush." There is no excuse for not picking up.

Blindness in children from dog fouling caused by Toxocara canis

Whilst the problem should not be exaggerated, it is necessary for dog owners and the public to know what they need to do to minimise the risk.

Toxocara canis is a parasite that lives inside dogs' bodies. It is a round, white worm (looks

like spaghetti) and it infects, most frequently, pregnant nursing bitches and young puppies.

Once ingested they can travel around the body, usually causing little problem. Very rarely though, they can settle in the soft tissue of the retina of the eye, where damage or even **blindness can be caused**, approximately 50 cases a year are recorded.

Preventative measures include:

- Worm your dog properly both as a puppy and as an adult.
- Clean up after your dog has fouled.
- Prevent dogs from licking your hands and face.
- Ensure hands are washed after playing on grassed areas where dogs are allowed and where dogs or puppies have been handled.

Using litter bins for dog waste

Some residents have asked us if they can put dog faeces in litter bins.

We can confirm that all East Riding of Yorkshire Council litter bins may be used for disposing of bagged up dog waste collected whilst walking your dog. If anyone leaves bags of dog waste on trees, bushes, the base of a lamp post etc. they are committing a littering offence that may also be punished by way of a £75 fixed penalty being issued.

North Cave Wetlands - Spring 2024

Our team led by Gary Dayes and Stuart Griffiths once again co-ordinated a spring weekend bird count from 10th to 12th May across our Reserve and recorded a record number of species, with a tally of 115 being well ahead of 2022's weekend record of 100. This was particularly gratifying, for as expected wader numbers were down owing to high water levels and less exposed muddy margins as a result of recent rains and lack of drainage capacity to drop levels quickly.

Included in the count were three rarities, which helped to draw a goodly number of visiting birders too. Since late April a rare continental Savi's Warbler has been singing its churring song and occasionally being seen in the bushes and reeds adjacent to the first stretch of Dryham Lane. On day one of the count two rare migrant White-winged Black Terns joined the more regular spring visiting Black Terns on Crosslands Lake - our only other record being in 1994 for four days. But the real crowd puller was a White-tailed Eagle, of the Fish Eagle family, and a very restricted breeder in the Isles off the north west of Scotland. Following the last naturally breeding bird shot in 1918 a re-introduction programme began in 1975, the first success being recorded in 1985, and around 150 pairs bred in 2023 including England's first re-introduction success. It is related to the Golden Eagle of the Scottish Highlands, but with broader wings, and is Britain's largest bird. Our bird was seen briefly on the first evening and reappeared the next morning over the lakes and the farmland to the north, and was viewed by over 40 watchers from Crosslands Hide.



The best lake this spring remains our most western lake 2A, a 500m walk from the gate by Crosslands Hide along Dryham Lane and just beyond the farmhouse. 12 pairs of Avocet nested there and also on the island on 1A, the lake just north of the farm, with a small number of chicks fledging. By the time of publication of this edition we anticipate our latest new hide should be open, giving great views over this latest extension to our wetlands' habitat.

7.30pm on the 1st Thursday of the Month, you're welcome to pop along and give us a try. You would be very welcome



All Saints, North Cave Bell Ringers

For centuries church bells have sounded, calling people to worship, in celebration of special occasions, in remembrance and to mark special events and these are still the bedrock for our ringing at All Saints.

We have quite a busy wedding schedule this year along with other special events that we have rung for, such as the opening day of the cricket club and the superb new patio area and prior to Barry's service of remembrance at the War Memorial to mark the 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings but of course our main focus is that of Sunday morning service ringing.

In April the band had a couple of days away ringing in North Yorkshire based around Whitby but also picking up the churches of Middleton, Pickering and Norton Juxta Malton, these towers had been well selected in advance for their fine peals of bells and, as it always seems to be on our trip away ringing both home and abroad, the weather was beautiful. Our fly away ringing trip this year is in October when we shall be spending five days on Guernsey, we just hope the bells are as fine as those in North Yorkshire?

Following our success in 2022 when we won the Joan Castle Memorial Trophy, which is awarded to the church/band which rings the most quarter peals within East Yorkshire in a year, we decided to take it easy it 2023 and didn't compete, but now, in 2024 we are back on it and leading our old friends and rivals from St Helens, Escrick. It is a big commitment for any band to try and reach around 50 quarter peals in a year, so this year we have decided to go for most of our attempts on a Sunday morning prior to the service, so hence the reason you may hear an early start from us from around 9.45am. To score a quarter peal we must ring a minimum number of changes in a method or several methods of our choice. It is not a given that every attempt succeeds. At All Saints we usually complete the number of changes in around forty-five minutes or so.

Without a doubt over the past ten months are minds have been on our £55,000.00 project to

install two additional bells to bring our marvellous ring of six bells to a full octave. This will provide better learning and achievement opportunities for the local band and other ringers from around the area, especially when worked alongside our East Riding School of Bell Ringing which we run from North Cave and our second Ringing Centre at Bubwith. Our full day ringing courses are always fully booked and attract ringers from all over Yorkshire and beyond, even the likes of Ripon Cathedral sent some of their ringers down to be trained by us, so the two additional bells are crucial for the development and continuation of bell ringing, both near and far and, of course, the audible benefits from around the village.

We have had a survey carried out by the Diocese of York, the church architect and a structural engineer and two quotations provided for this work, so all the ground work has now been completed and the faculty application has now gone off to York. We have had to make a few design changes along the way, with the main one being the installation of a low level secondary steel sub frame spanning between the North and South walls of the belfry internally, underneath the original 1919 bell frame. This new frame would be what the two new bell pits would sit on - so total independent of the existing frame, yet still side by side.

The two new bells will be cast by Taylors Bell Foundry in Loughborough, the same founders of our original six and most importantly they will be cast on the same profile as the 1919 bells, with the main installation being carried out by Whites of Appleton from Oxfordshire. Our aim is to have this work complete by September 2025.

Fund raising has been going very well without us really having a big launch, this is being planned for the weekend of the 7th & 8th September 2024 with more information to follow. There are many grants that we can tap into too, but we have been blessed to have donations offered already to pay for the two new bells already, this is for their casting and tunning, we still have all the other engineering work to deal with.

to £20 for a foot of bell rope, to some of the larger hardware items such as wheels, pullies and framework. On some items we can have individual names built into them, however, the plan will be to have a plague displayed naming all of our sponsors within the church.

I would like to say a big thank you to Jill Marwood and her team for running two bingo nights for us at the Village Hall, which raised a total of £1,750.00, just amazing, part of the money raised will go to pay the structural engineer, so those who attended these nights, you now know where some of your money has been spent, again, thank you.

I would also like to thank Sharron and Sam. from the White Hart for their kind donation and to all those who give up their time to put kind words about our ringing on the Community Facebook page.
