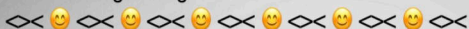

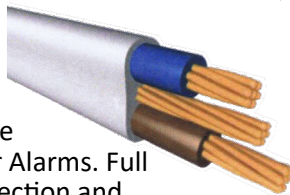

Sandra Thornham, Queen of Everthorpe

1.04.43 – 25.04.25

Sandra Thornham was a legend among the communities of South Cave, North Cave and Everthorpe all her life, and also my dear friend and closest neighbour on High Road.

In December 1963, Sandra married the tall handsome quiet-type, Martin Thornham, to become the world's most glamorous pig farmer's wife at Church Hill (now Thornham Close) South Cave. Their full life together raised three children, a successful business, and funds for many good causes as well as co-founding the South Cave Preservation Society, before moving to Everthorpe in 1989. She loved her home so much she said she only wanted to leave it when they carried her out, and she got her wish, complete with her favourite lip gloss.

Semidetached neighbours can often be love or hate – thankfully we bonded. I first met Sandra when we moved in next door and were invited round instantly, despite being exhausted new parents with a baby daughter in tow who wriggled and gurgled on Sandra's sheepskin rug forging a lifelong friendship. We have been in and out of each other's houses ever since. One winter, Sandra and I planted two willow withies together on the verge opposite. They've grown now, twisted into each other: like us.

Sandra enjoyed good company, and her door always opened with a warm welcome, and a glass of something. I think of her as a farmer of kindness. She knew how to make it grow, how to nurture and spread it far and wide. She modelled social capital before that was a thing. There is little physical evidence now of all the effort she invested – but that never distracted her. She just wanted good stuff to happen for people. Her first concern was the frail, the lonely and the sick. I lost count, as I'm sure Martin did, of the times we ferried her somewhere to deliver something nice, an encouraging note, or their shopping.

Vicar Barry Worsdale shared his reflections at Sandra's funeral on Monday 12 May, creating words from 'PROSECCO' – a product that meant a lot to the lady herself!

CORE = Sandra was at the centre of so many good things in the villages.



CROPS – how her garden grew.

POOR = Sandra's amazing work raising money for so many good causes and helping so many of us do the right thing in life,

PROSE = her many cards of encouragement to neighbours and friends, and

COPE – how she dealt with whatever was thrown at her.

Her commitment to the countryside, the soil, was profound. Her happiest place was smelling the garden at first light, with the birds. So - all the harder to watch as nature battered Forge House with floods, long after she and Martin should have escaped the vagaries of weather. It happened twice, prompting the pioneering 'Slow the Flow' work that happened in Everthorpe this year. Her fortitude, shown during those wretched house refits, was called upon with the diagnosis that we all dreaded.

After Christmas this year she said to me - 'What does it matter?' We were in the kitchen, surrounded by the all the daily plates she was

spinning, with the blasted oil boiler playing up again, and she was in pain. Badly bent. She'd lost weight. I did the upbeat – 'wait for the warmer weather, come the spring'. She knew better – but for kindness, let me say my say, and bring round broth.

So full of life, she knew death and its coming. She had attended many in their final days, quiet words, a gentle touch, a flower posy. I was so very glad that James, Sarah, Marion and all her dear friends attended Sandra with that same loving kindness to help her through. And she was glad and grateful too – 'they're so wonderfully beautiful and kind' - just days before she died.

Thank you, Sandra, for your wonderful life, thoughts and unique ways.

The following words bring her back to me: 'The Intercontinental' (internet), The International Space Station (a recent passion), 'Moleing' - burying the electricity cabling up the hill. Her glorious garden and hog roasts. Selling so many poppies, year in year out. Auction prizes for another of your fundraisers. Christmas Carols at the Bear. Christmas Carols on the Green. Christmas Carols In the Games Room. The Games Room 'village hall' and all its

dinners, auctions, pantomimes. 'Hi Hun! Looking gorgeous today - Bye-zeebye' The old Post Box. The Old Tarts. The South Cave Preservation Society. Sid the snake in the pond. Warm Red Wine. 'A bit of ruby lush.' Stoked wood fires. 'Excusez Moi S'il vous plaît ...' The Queen's garden party. 'Comme ci, comme ça' Grey Owl and Auntie Pam. Our Willow.

Our lives intertwined. I will miss you no end. But your kindnesses, your thoughtfulness, these will never be forgotten by all in Everthorpe and beyond.

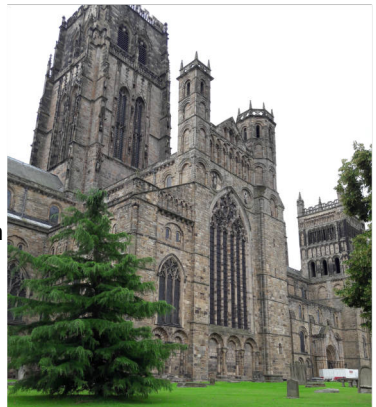
Rev. Barry reflects on being a Royal Maundy Recipient



This year, Maundy Thursday fell on 17th April and I had the privilege of going to Durham Cathedral to receive Maundy money from the King.

The last time this service was held in Durham Cathedral was in 1967. The Royal Maundy recipients are chosen from the Diocese of the Northern Province of England and Scotland. Royal Maundy can be traced back, in England, with

King Edward I.

The service derives its name from the Latin word 'mandatum', meaning 'command' and its opening words from Jesus, when He said "I give you a new commandment". From the 15th century, the number of recipients has been related to the years of the sovereign's life. Recipients are now pensioners selected because of the Christian service they have rendered to the church and the community.

The distribution is in two parts and the gifts, which are handed to the recipients, are symbolic. There is a red purse, which contains a nominal allowance for clothing and provisions, formally given in kind and a payment for the redemption of the royal gown.

This year there was a £5 coin

commemorating Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother and a 50 pence coin telling the story of the Second World War.

There is also a white purse, which contains the maundy coins.



These are silver coins with the value of one pence; two pence; three pence and four pence. The recipient receives as many pence as the age of the sovereign. So this year, as King Charles III was 76, all recipients received 76 pence-worth of silver maundy coins. There are six arms dishes used for the distribution of



the pouches and coins. The number of recipients relate to the age of the Monarch; this year there were seventy six men and seventy six women receiving the Maundy Money.

The King comes to each person in turn, places the pouches in their hands and says a few words. As well as the beautiful service the singing, readings and prayers there was also the attendance of the King's Body Guard of the Yeomen of the Guard, which play an important part in this service.

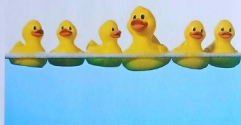

PLAY AREA

Things have moved on massively since we worked on the funding applications nearly 25 years ago (which resulted in the installation of our current play area 21 years ago). Then applications were made on paper forms, you asked for a specific amount, either large or small depending on the charity/organisation concerned, and if you were lucky you could double your money with "matched funding" on certain donations.

Today it is necessary to go through a vetting process before it is possible to even start an application to some funding sources; everything is online (not a problem) and many charitable trusts are accessed solely via a council portal. There are numerous hurdles to jump through with "compliance" to ensure the organisation is meeting the correct standards in the way it is run.

The latest change has occurred within the funding source (formerly WREN now FCC) which provided the bulk of our revenue for the current play area. If we were to apply for £100,000 towards the new regeneration then they would require 10.7% of that amount from a "third party donor" as a means of ensuring the funding to other applicants can continue in the future. It is very unlikely that we will receive such a sizeable donation from one person or organisation so we will be looking to raise as much as possible through smaller donations. Please help us to make this possible either by approaching one of the NCPFA committee members or through the Localgiving fund.
