



All Saints, North Cave Bell Ringers

Following nearly five years of planning; from 25th January 2026, the bells at All Saints will fall silent for around five weeks, to allow our bell project to be realised. This will augment our existing ring, of six bells, into what will be a truly fine ring of eight bells. Apart from the all-important fund raising; we also held many meetings with the Diocese of York, architects, structural engineers, bell hangers, stone-masons, bell founders and bell advisers, as the planning for such a project with a Grade 1 listed building must be meticulous. Great detail had to be gone into, to ensure that we deliver a truly sympathetic installation, not only for us (the village) but also for future generations.

Hopefully no stone has been left unturned; everything from making sure that the two new bells were cast by the same company as our original bells back in 1919, within the same foundry hall, using the same outer bell mould casings, to keep the bell profiles the same, right down to the stonemasons selecting the new mortar to match that of the existing, along with changing our specification of the pad stones to that of York Stone.

At the end of the day this is a £60k engineering project that involves lowering and lifting of steelwork, old bells and new bells, 50ft up into the third-floor belfry of a Grade 1

listed building, a job that will be in the safe hands of our bell hangers, Whites of Appleton from Oxfordshire.

Our thanks again must go to the individuals, village groups, ringing societies and associations who have made this project financially possible.

Please note that the church clock will be out of action during this period. It is, also, worth pointing out that our church clock is of historical interest! I only found this out myself around a year ago, I shall share more details in the future.

In early January we held a six-hour training workshop at All Saints, which was hosted by our Ringing School. These workshops provide ringers with a blend of both theory and practical sessions - with ringers joining us from Market Weighton, North Ferriby, Hessle, Nafferton, Bubwith and Spalding Moor, it clearly shows the importance of North Cave as a Teaching Hub for this fine ancient art of English change bell ringing.



West Wolds Slow the Flow

Everthorpe Lane

If you have been down Everthorpe Lane in January, you can't have failed to see the road closure signs or the works starting.

As shown on the front cover, from mid-January, ERYC Flood Risk contractors were busy working on Everthorpe Lane as part of the drainage improvements to Littlemoor Drain.

We are immensely grateful to the ERYC Flood Risk Team for finding the funding and implementing this scheme. We have slight reservations in that, due to the constraints faced by the Council (working only on Highway land and not removing any soil from the site for cost reasons) the design has limited capacity to 'slow the flow', and is perhaps better described as 'direct the flow'. A new ditch on the north side of the Lane will catch most storm-water coming off the fields, whilst the ditch on the south side will have 'leaky dams' to help slow some of the water. The two sides will be connected with a pipe under the road to allow all the water to flow into the ditch which connects to Littlemoor Drain. Together with improvements already carried out at Finkle Street, to re-direct Littlemoor Drain into a relief drain towards Mires Beck, the overall result should be considerably more protection against property flooding at Everthorpe Lane and Finkle Street. Well done, ERYC!

Fishponds and Drewton Beck

As noted last time, we will be working with East Yorkshire Rivers Trust on leaky dams and habitat works upstream of North Cave, along Drewton Beck, as well as habitat restoration at a designated Local Wildlife Site, the 'fishponds' near Blossoms Lane. Anyone who knows the muddy footpath between Blossoms Lane and Townend Lane will be pleased to know that we are negotiating with ERYC Rights of Way team, to install a length of boardwalk in the section nearest the the fishponds. Due to cost, its length will be limited, but it is a start! Thanks again to the Carver Estate for being willing to consider our proposals along the Becks.

Hotham

We are scheduled to discuss watercourse enhancement at Hotham Park - another 'watch this space' for what we hope will be good news.

Elsewhere

We previously mentioned working at Woodale, above Ellerker. Planning, which is complicated, progresses! We are also talking to landowners and flood risk agencies at Newbald, in another work-in-progress. We have also considered projects at Skidby and Driffield, as the usefulness of the 'Slow the Flow' approach becomes more widely recognised. You never quite know where any conversation will lead, but the important thing is to have them.

Finally, we had a great discussion with the new Yorkshire Water 'Rivers Health Team', which we hope will herald the start of a productive relationship with this important Flood Risk Agency. With their help, we can also refresh our 'Check the Becks' project, and possibly look to do some 'Balsam Bashing' this summer, to help prevent the spread of this dangerous invasive species.

Funding and Suppliers

As reported in the last edition, the Playing Field Committee sub-group continues to complete funding application forms. No quick job these days - the funders want to know so much more information than they did around 20+ years ago for the current play area.

Just before Christmas, we were disappointed to hear that we had been unsuccessful with the Local Place funding bid. It would seem that we did not fulfil their criteria for measurable outcomes. How does one measure the success, or otherwise, of a play area?

Perhaps we should take up residence on the area and count everyone who uses the space now and after the new area is in? All we can say is that, despite it being old and a bit past its sell-by date, it is still well used by children. Once we have our beautiful new play area, we would expect to see more people using it. Despite this set-back, we will continue to seek opportunities and complete more applications.

Our equipment suppliers have reassured us that they will do everything they can to help minimise the expected cost increases, but we will still have to spend more than originally anticipated.

Local Funding

Unfortunately, local businesses have been resoundingly silent when approached for donations. If you work for a local business please can you encourage your employer to consider making a donation. We will be more than happy to acknowledge the donation on a plaque at the end of the project in the same way as we have for the patio funding. Having said that, the patio plaque has had to be redone because we discovered that someone had been missed! It will be added to the Clubhouse wall before too long.

LocalGiving Fund

We continue to be extremely grateful for your support, shown through the LocalGiving site. Since we started our appeal in, October 2024,



we have received £1668. The average donation has been around £25 but we have also received individual donations of £100 and one of £500, which is extremely touching. Playing Field Trees

The sad decision has been taken that the Poplars on the western boundary will have to be removed. The roots are becoming a liability for the safe use of the football field and will be more so once the pitches are finally relocated further south, away from the cricket square. In addition, the leaves and twigs that blow out regularly in high winds create more issues for the football teams. It has been agreed that more appropriate tree species will be added to the surrounding boundaries to help provide shade and eventually act as wind breaks.

The signature Ash tree on the Cricket field will be appropriately pruned, to retain it as a veteran tree. It is hoped that this will encourage it to continue to regenerate in the lower levels and eventually create a smaller tree. This tree marks an ancient field boundary from the days before the playing field was created and, as such, is an historic landmark in the village landscape and a unique feature of our field.

How many ways can you kill a tree...

...without really meaning to?

Most of us love trees, we recognise that they add value and beauty to our homes and neighbourhoods. But we are often careless of their simple needs for survival.

Look at the images on the right. At the top is a tree, in a garden, in a village, happy and healthy, somewhere in East Yorkshire, in August 2016. Then someone decided to build a house in that garden. The middle image shows the tree in April 2019, part of a building site, compacted stone over its roots, denying them air and water, but hey, the trunk is protected by orange plastic fencing! All will be well...

No it won't. The bottom image is September 2021. The tree roots have not only been crushed under stone, but a nice raised bed has made sure that the trunk base is no longer at its natural level. In September, the tree should have the same amount of leaf cover as the first photo in August, but it doesn't...

Stakes and ties



Another great way to kill trees, without really intending to, is to stake and tie new ones, to give them support, then completely forget to loosen or remove the ties. You can spot this in gardens and housing estates across the land. Trees pass water and nutrients to their leaves through their bark, so ignoring and leaving them tightly tied is a great way to strangle them to death. It should only take a few years.

Bonus tip...

If you are in a hurry, strimming grass around the base of trees is quite a quick way of unintentionally killing them. It will usually cut straight through the bark, weakening them until they give up and fall over. Tidy, but dead.

Alternatively... just give it a little thought. How many trees are being killed in your area?
